4★ TEXAS A&M over New Mexico - LY vs NM, A&M was outgained (236-370) but won the TO battle (+3) in Mike Sherman's 1st victory as the Aggies HC 28-22 on the road. A&M is 20-1 S/'88 in home openers, but lost LY to ASU. NMex looks to be in a rebuilding year with just 9 starters back and a new HC and schemes on both sides of the ball. A&M will be much improved with 16 ret starters and now is in Sherman's 2nd year. A&M is off a disastrous 4-8 year and should want to gain confidence with big early season wins and has the schedule to accomplish that. LY A&M's 10 returning starters were upset by Ark St in the opener and expect a defense which allowed 462 ypg and 5.2 ypc to dominate a New Mexico offense that is switching to a pass oriented scheme. The Aggies have a bye next week and will hold nothing back. **FORECAST: TEXAS A&M 45 New Mexico 17**

3★ UTEP over Buffalo - These two teams are going in different directions. Buffalo was the MAC Champ last year and does have 14 ret sts including super RB Starks but loses QB Willy and caught a lot of breaks LY to get that title. UTEP could have been a bowl squad but had a couple of tough losses to finish just 5-7. They have one of the most underrated QB's in the country in Trevor Vittatoe and they also have 15 ret sts. Last year these two met in Buffalo and it was close until Buf got a 34 yd TD pass with :30 left in the half (1 play after 4th down conv) to take the lead and romped in the 2H. It was an unusual trip north for UTEP who were preoccupied by the biggest home game in their history (Texas) which was played the following week. This year it will be a strange trip to the Southwest for Buffalo and UTEP is playing with legitimate revenge. ST and defense are close but UTEP has a large edge on off (#41 vs #112). **FORECAST: UTEP 40 Buffalo 23**

3★ Illinois over Missouri (St Louis) - The Illini were just 5-7 last year and Missouri was the Big 12 North Champs but these two are vastly different teams. Illinois could go to a BCS bowl and Missouri is the least experienced team in the country. These two have met in St Louis each of the last 3 years with the Tigers winning by an avg of 38-30 and covering all 3 by just 2 ppg. Illinois has veteran senior QB Juice Williams and one of the most explosive offenses in the country along with a much improved defense. Missouri has an untested QB after Chase Daniel led them to all 3 wins over Illinois and just 9 starters back. History says Missouri but this year's talent says Illinois is the stronger team and gets a more comfortable win than expected. **FORECAST: Illinois 37 Missouri 23**

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ Georgia (+) over OKLAHOMA ST - This is one of the best non-conf games of the year. Georgia is a much stronger team in odd numbered years under Richt as they tend to be undervalued and that was the case in 2007 when they were just -6 at home vs Oklahoma St in the opener. OSU was the popular upset pick yet Georgia delivered for us on these pages with a 35-14 win and had a 376-266 yard edge. OSU is once again the trendy pick this year and is loaded on offense with the return of their "triplets" in QB Robinson, RB Hunter and WR Bryant. They also have an improved D with the addition of DC Bill Young. Georgia loses their star QB Stafford and RB Moreno to the NFL and this will be a hostile setting for young QB Cox. HC Mark Richt is an amazing 30-4 in opposing teams stadiums. UGA has opened on the road only once in his tenure and that was in 2003 when they beat Clemson 30-0 but that was with a 3rd year starting QB. Richt has been an AD just 3 times in 4 years and has won all 3 outright (avg cover 18.6 ppg). Georgia has the edge at the line of scrimmage and our #9 D (OSU #36). OSU did avg 555 ypg at home last year and is 7-1 as a HF with their avg cover by 14.4 ppg and their only non-cover by a half point. **FORECAST: Georgia (+) 28 OKLAHOMA ST 27**

2★ WISCONSIN over N Illinois - Wisconsin has won 13 straight Camp Randall openers by an avg of 20 ppg. The Badgers are off a 7-6 season and have just 11 returning starters but are under some pressure after 10 losses the last two years when Badger fans were expecting BCS. Last year Nill was a veteran squad with 21 ret sts and this year have just 11 back. Nill has lost 5 straight openers to BCS teams but only lost by 14 ppg to the 4 from the Big Ten. In 2007 UW did roll to a 44-3 win here but that was late in the year vs an injury ravaged team. Northern's emphasis should be staying healthy here and last year Wisky could have mauled Akron but gave up a cheap TD at the end of the 1H and a garbage TD with :38 left and only won by 21 (-26') and won't be as generous here. **FORECAST: WISCONSIN 41 N Illinois 17**

2★ Navy (+) over OHIO ST - These two last met in a rain soaked 1981 Liberty Bowl. Ohio St has covered 5 straight home openers but this time has a massive game against USC on deck. Last year the week before USC they trailed going into the 4Q vs Ohio as a 33' pt favorite. OSU is 5-10 ATS vs non-conf and Navy is 6-3 ATS in road openers. OSU lost 2 LB's and 2 CB's to the NFL and projected starter Moehrer, but still has a very athletic defensive front 7. Last year Navy had just 12 FD's vs Pitt and 11 vs ND and in both games got the majority of their yards and pts vs the backups. OSU lost RB Wells prior to USC so they probably won't take chances late and if their minds wander ahead to USC, the Mids will keep trying until the end and could get some big plays. They are 14-4 ATS as an AD. **FORECAST: Navy 17 (+) OHIO ST 31**

NC STATE 27 S Carolina 23 - Last year a young NCSt team lost QB Wilson late 2Q to injury while trailing just 3-0 in the opener. SC's D teed off in the 2H and turned it into a 34-0 rout with a 369-143 yard edge. The Wolfpack, with a healthy Wilson, was much stronger in the 2H of 2008 winning their last 4 of the reg season and led the bowl until Wilson was knocked out with injury. This year they have 14 ret sts including Wilson and with only a couple of FCS foes on deck will go all out in this Thurs night game. SC has just 13 sts back and only 59% lettermen returning (NCAA worst) with a huge SEC game at Georgia on deck. Spurrier is 8-4-1 as an AD at SC. SC does have the defensive edge but NCSt has larger edges on offense and ST's. Spurrier has won all 4 openers at SC (2-2 ATS) while O'Brien is 3-9 ATS in openers but 8-5 SU.

UTAH 34 Utah St 17 - The Utes home crowd figures to be excited to greet the team that finished #2 in the country last year. LY Utah had a large record crowd for their road trip to

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Logan and they witnessed a 58-10 win. Utah has won 11 in a row SU and are 14-6 ATS in the "Battle of the Brothers". These two have played every year since 1943 but will take the next two years off in the series making this one even more important. Utah does have a pair of road games on deck vs bowl elig teams from '08 and with just 12 ret starters is not as strong as the '08 version. The Aggies are much stronger this year with 16 starters back and just 14 lettermen and new HC Andersen is very familiar with the Utes as he served as the DC there the L5Y. USU is also 3-1 ATS in trips to Salt Lake with their lone non-cover by a half pt. Call this much closer than LY's game.

BOISE ST 30 Oregon 20 - Boise wants to be in consideration for a BCS bowl any year they go unbeaten and three things put added emphasis on this one. Last year they went unbeaten but were not really even in the mix. They lost their bowl game to TCU and a Ducks team they beat finished #10 with 3 losses while Boise was #11 with 1 loss. Oregon lost a lot of talent with just 9 starters back and also lost their HC. Last year's home loss to Boise could mostly be chalked up to QB injuries for the Ducks. The Ducks are 8-1 SU (incl 6-1 ATS run) vs non-conf foes with 8 of those foes from BCS conf. Boise has not lost a reg season home game on the blue turf since 2001 (49-0!!!).

Troy 34 BOWLING GREEN 20 - Last year BG was actually one of the best MAC teams and if not for two upset losses in MAC games could easily have been in the title game. They also beat Pitt on the road and walloped Wyoming. The Falcons are 8-1 the L8Y at Perry Stadium vs non-MAC tms (avg score 48-17). This year's BG team only has 10 ret starters, has a 1st year HC and figures to go through some growing pains even with a veteran senior QB. BG's main problem is replacing all 4 starters from the D-line. Troy had a young QB last year and then lost him to injury in week 5. Levi Brown took over and improved every game. Troy won the SBC and should have won the New Orleans Bowl and has 12 starters back and we rate their offense #50 and defense #58, both high marks for a SBC team. This is an odd trip for Troy but last year they went into Death Valley and led LSU 31-3 in the 3Q and also outplayed Ohio St most of the game. They do have a big game on deck vs the defending champ Florida but have a few extra days to get ready for that and they know just how important a win here is.

BALL ST 34 N Texas 27 - This game has a team that was 12-0 in the regular season last year and has their star RB back (Miquale Lewis 1,736 rush) versus a NT team that has a 1st time starting QB and is coming off a 1-11 season. If this game was played last year Ball St would have been favored by 5 or 6 TD's. Ball St is weaker this year primarily due to the loss of their star QB Nate Davis, HC Brady Hoke and 4 OL starters. NT has won 3 games in 2 years under Todd Dodge but has 16 starters back and teams hit their peak in the 3rd year of a new HC. Also the young QB is a rare VHT for NT in Dodge's son Riley who of course knows the offense inside and out. Dodge is just 5-8 as an AD and Ball St is 11-5 as a HF and this is an odd trip for a Texas team to make. NT actually rates the edge on offense (#82 vs #106) and will keep it closer than expected.

Friday, September 4th

Tulsa vs TULANE - Last year when these two met we used a 4★ on Tulsa (-28) at home vs a Tulane team that was missing most of its top off players and the Hurricane rolled to an easy 56-7 win. Tulsa is 4-0 ATS vs Tulane with an avg win of 45-12 and avg cover by 16.5. Both teams have 13 ret sts but Tulane has 53 lettermen ret to Tulsa's 39. Tulane gets RB Anderson and WR Williams, their top 2 skill players, back after missing the '08 matchup with injury. Tulsa RB Adams rushed for a schl rec 323 yards, QB Johnson and their top WR have moved on. This will be a tighter game than last year and in their opener on the road Tulsa trailed UAB at the half but won by 23 despite having a new QB. Todd Graham is just 4-7 as an AF and Tulane did almost upset #14 ECar in last year's home opener. **Get Friday's winner on the Private Play Hotline after 3:00 pm ET on September 4th. Akron also got to their 38 playing on a rain soaked field (remnants of Hurricane Ernesto). The Zips held Penn St to 76 yards rushing. Last year Penn St dominated most foes and won their non-conf games by an avg of 53-10 and that included Oregon St! Akron does have a solid off that avg 30 ppg and returns 9 starters. Brookhart has covered 3 of 4 vs ranked teams with that half pt loss in '06 the only non-cover. They did get a backdoor vs #13 Wisky LY as they were outrushed 404-70. The biggest edge here is the Lions #15 offense vs Akron's #106 defense and RB Royster should have a big day.

MICHIGAN 37 W Michigan 20 - Michigan has been upset in their last 2 home openers (App St & Utah) after having won the previous 9. UM is 24-1 SU (0-5 ATS run) vs the MAC and we mention that because their one loss was last year to Toledo. UM is 4-11 ATS in their 1st lined game of the season. These two last met in '01 & '02 (UM 2-0 ATS). Michigan has a huge game vs ND on deck but must take every opponent seriously after a 3-9 season including that upset loss to Toledo a team that also finished just 3-9 LY. Here they take on a 9-4 WM team that went to a bowl while the Wolves were home for the holidays. WM has talent but it is very inexperienced on D with just 3 starters back and Michigan avg just 20.3 ppg LY but should have one of the most improved offenses in the country led by new starting QB Forcier (PS#16). Expect a fully focused Michigan squad. While Cubit has knocked off 3 BCS teams in 4 years he has dropped his last two openers to WV and Neb by 30.5 ppg. WM may hold some stuff back for a more winnable game next week at Indy.

NOTRE DAME 40 Nevada 23 - ND is now 1-5 ATS in season openers and are just 3-13 ATS at home vs non-BCS schools. Nevada is just 1-12 SU visiting BCS teams losing by an avg of 43-17 and is 0-11 SU vs IA foes in openers losing by 27.5 ppg. Nevada has one of the NCAA's most exciting QB's in Colin Kaepernick and has a tough defense and return two diff RB's who have led the WAC in rushing the last two years. HC Ault opened 0-7 as an AD but is 5-4 since and Nevada has a bye on deck, are one of the top non-BCS teams and they should be excited about this trip. ND is just 7-13 as a HF under Weis and has a major game next week vs rival Michigan on the road. This is a battle of two quality teams and the situation and angles favor Nevada and the offenses are nearly even. ND has large edges on defense (#18 vs #68) and a major edge on ST's (#18 vs #115). ND also was just 7-6 LY with Weis almost getting fired and cannot afford to overlook any team especially an explosive Nevada squad.

† **Kentucky 37 Miami, Oh 20 (Cincinnati)** - These two last met in '91 and this game is in Cincy so the crowd should be fairly even with UK just 82 miles away and Miami 39. UK actually has the 2nd longest non-conf win streak in the country at 14 with their avg win by 20. UK has a bye next week and has gone head-to-head over recruits with Miami so they should be focused. Brooks has been a favorite away from home just twice in 5 years (2-0 ATS). Miami does have all their key skill players back from '08 but has a new 1st time HC and new schemes and a D we rate at the bottom. UK has edges everywhere including ST's and will be motivated.

† **Oklahoma 41 Byu 24 (Arlington)** - This gm will be played in the new home of the Dallas Cowboys. They last met in '94 when BYU beat the Sooners 31-6. OU avg an amazing 51.1 ppg in '08 and has QB Bradford and most of their skill players back. They allowed 24.5 ppg in '08 but with 9 starters back actually have our #3 rated D. BYU has QB Hall and this is their shot in Big 12 country at getting to a rare National Title game as we expect them to sweep the MWC. The biggest problem for BYU is a young O-line (1 ret sfr) in a loud environment, matched up against our #1 rated D-line.

UAB 30 Rice 23 - The home team is 2-0 ATS with Rice losing here in '05 and winning by 5 at home in '06. Rice is 7-2 vs the CUSA East. UAB is 11-2 SU in home openers but is 0-3 ATS in them with most of the wins vs IAA foes. These are two teams going in different directions this year as Rice is off a super 10-3 season incl. a bowl romp but QB Clement and WR Dilliard are gone along with 25 other lettermen. UAB has 17 ret sts and just 15 lettermen lost and has dynamic QB Webb back. Rice's young QB is making his first road start. Rice is just 1-4 ATS as an AF in 5 yrs. Rice has the edge on defense and ST's but UAB has the offensive edge and the situational edge with the more experienced team at home. LY at home UAB led Tulsa at the half, beat Marshall and only lost to Memphis by 3 and to CUSA Champ EC by 4, so they play well at home and are in the 3rd year of Callaway's system.

Baylor 27 WAKE FOREST 24 - These two met LY in the opener and WF dominated on the road in Art Briles' 1st HG. Baylor had 5 TO's that led to 21 WF pts and Wake's 28 pt win (41-13) was their largest in an opener since 1958. The key here may have been what happened at the half. Baylor inserted true frosh QB Griffin into the lineup and he provided some spark and went on to have a fine season (15-3 ratio) after that as the starter. Briles was 4-1 as an AD LY including covers on a trip to the East Coast (Conn) and vs the #5 and #7 ranked teams. It used to be an automatic to go against WF as a HF (2-14-1 from 2000-'06) but they are 6-5 in that role recently. They did beat Ole Miss (Cotton Bowl Champ) here last year. The Bears are the stronger team on Off, Def and have a large edge on ST's (#15 vs #82) and pull the road upset.

Minnesota 27 SYRACUSE 20 - Minny is 6-1 SU/ATS in road openers with their avg cover by 16.8 ppg. Syracuse is 1-3 ATS in home openers (0-4 SU) with the 3 spread losses by 18.5 ppg and are 0-6 in non-conf BCS HG's with their avg loss by 18.5 ppg. SU HC Marrone has weeded out the "bad apples" as 18 scholarship players have left and he brought in PS#4QB Greg Paulus (4 years Duke basketball) as his QB. Minny, meanwhile, has the most experienced team in the country. Minnesota has the talent edge but Syracuse has the excitement and the Gophers may be looking ahead to opening their new stadium next week.

E MICHIGAN 27 Army 24 - Both of these teams are on the rise this year and both have new HC's. Army's new HC Ellerson did a great job at Cal Poly and came within 3 missed xp's of upsetting Wisconsin (lost OT) as they would have won just making one of the 3. Army made a solid switch to the option last year and after an 0-4 start played a lot stronger the rest of the year once the players caught onto the offense. Ellerson runs the option so he will look like a genius on offense. Last year EM QB Schmitt did not practice with the team during the season and struggled but after a 3 week layoff at the end of the year he threw for 484 and 516 yds in the last two games. EM has 17 ret sts but is switching the offense so he probably won't be as effective as he was at season's end. EM does rate the edge on offense (#71 vs #120) but Army has it on D (#88 vs #119) with EM having a large edge on special teams (#50 vs #102). Army has just 12 ret sts making their 1st road start and they've dropped 12 straight openers. LY FB Mooney rushed for 229 at home in a tight 17-13 Army win and this figures to be tight again.

PURDUE 27 Toledo 17 - Purdue is 11-1 SU (4-4 ATS, 4 IAA tms) in West Lafayette opens with an avg score of 41-16 but 0-2 ATS in openers vs the MAC. They last met in '07 when Purdue won in the Glass Bowl 52-24 (-6). Both teams have new HC's but Purdue's Coach Hope was on the staff LY so he does not have as big a learning curve. Toledo's new HC does inherit the more exp team with just 7 lettermen lost (Purdue 19). Both teams are much stronger than in '08 and Purdue will have more emphasis on this one than most Big Ten teams as it is Hope's 1st HG. Toledo is just 7-15 as an AD. This will be a lower scoring game than most expect.

Stanford 34 WASH ST 17 - In a heavy downpour LY on the Farm, SU shutout WSU 58-0. The visitor had won 7 in a row SU but the HT has won the last 2. Stanford is 7-3 ATS in their 1st conf AG and are 13-4 ATS vs the Cougars. Last year the Cougars lost their HG's by an avg of 47-18 and while they are stronger this year (15 ret sts) that is a lot of ground to make up. Stanford is in the rare role of AF and is 0-2-1 getting upset twice over 7 yrs. The biggest mismatch here is the Stanford run game powered by a top notch O-line which faces a rebuilt Cougar front 4 that has just 1 starter back after allowing 248 ypg rush and 5.8 ypc last year.

AUBURN 31 Louisiana Tech 17 - Last year we used an LT team off a 5-7 season catching SEC member Miss St that was off a rare bowl game. It was also the first SEC squad to travel to Ruston and LT delivered the outright upset for us. This year LT is off a bowl and Auburn is off a rare losing season and playing their first HG under Gene Chizik. These two last met in '04 and Auburn (-26) rolled 52-7 in a midseason sandwich. They do have an SEC game on deck. Chizik is 1-3 ATS as a favorite and Dooley actually interviewed for the Auburn HC job last year that eventually went to Chizik. Auburn has the edges all around with its biggest on defense (#28 vs #82). Dooley is 3-7 as an AD and this time they face a motivated SEC team off a rare losing year.

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† **Alabama 20 Virginia Tech 16 (Atlanta)** - What a difference a year makes. Last year Alabama was a dog to Clemson here in Atlanta and steam rolled the ACC favorite 34-10 with a 239-0 rush edge. This time Bama is favored. VT is a much stronger team than they were in '08 with 15 ret sts (10 LY). The last time VT took on an SEC squad they were #9 and LSU was #2 and it was not pretty as they lost 48-7 in Death Valley being outgained 598-149. These two last met in the '98 Music City Bowl which VT won 38-7. VT has not travelled as well as they usually do to bowls the last 2 years but will be well represented here. Saban is 8-1 SU in openers but is 3-3 ATS and his one SU loss was when LSU was +7 at VT vs Beamer and they went down 26-8. VT is 7-3 as an AD but Bama actually has the ST edge (#3 vs #23).

Idaho 24 N MEXICO ST 23 - Last year Idaho snapped a 17 game conf losing streak with a home upset of the Aggies 20-14 and Idaho is 4-1 SU in the series but did lose their last trip here by 14. Idaho RB McCarty rushed for a career high 161 vs the Aggies LY. Idaho is improved this year with 13 ret sts and they are in the 3rd year under HC Akey while NMSt is undergoing drastic changes with a new HC with new schemes on offense and defense and have just 10 ret sts. Idaho has a slight edge overall but these are two of the weakest teams in the NCAA and Idaho is 2-7 as an AF this decade. We can't lay points with Idaho but they can grab a tight rare road win despite a 8-53 SU road record.

CALIFORNIA 41 Maryland 13 - Last year Cal was ambushed on the East Coast. Maryland was a talented team (8-5 and bowl winner) but put little effort into their first two games and barely got past a IAA foe and then lost to Middle Tenn. Cal came in off an impressive win over Mich St and a 66-3 wipeout of Wash St and entered the rankings at #23. Maryland smartly moved the game to noon which is 9am Cal time and they jumped out to a 21-3 lead on a humid day (rare for Cal) and won 35-27. This year Cal gets the Terps travelling cross country and Cal has 15 returning starters. The Terps have a very young squad that lost 30 lettermen and has just 9 starters back making their first road start. Cal returned the time zone favor by making this a night game which will start at 10:00 pm EST. Cal only has EWash on deck and is playing this with a much more talented team and legitimate revenge.

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UNDERDOG PLAY OF THE WEEK

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OHIO +4' over Connecticut

Take an 8-5 Big East team that won its bowl 38-20 over the MAC Champs and pit them against a lowly 4-8 MAC team to beat and note that the Big East tm won their only previous meeting 37-19 in '02 and you would expect the BE team a 2 or 3 TD favorite. Delving a little deeper we see an upset here. Ohio is 5-1 SU in home openers and knocked off Pitt here in Solich's 1st year. Ohio is a team that opened 0-4 LY but could easily have been 4-0 at that point which would have made them an 8-4 team instead of 4-8. OU is 11-6 ATS at home. Last year UC needed OT to get past MAC member Temple on the road. Ohio only has NT on deck and should be sky high while UC will be looking ahead to NCar and Baylor the next 2 weeks. While UC is a veteran group they lose their star off player in Donald Brown (2,083 rush) and the ret skill players combined (incl the QB) do not equal his numbers. OU was an injury plagued team in '08 and that makes them even more exp than their 14 ret sts.

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OTHER COLLEGE GAMES CONT

USC 41 San Jose St 10 - USC has won 11 straight season openers (7-4 ATS) by a 38-11 avg margin. Last year they had a bye prior to their big matchup with Ohio St but may not put their full focus on this as their first road game is next week in Columbus. San Jose has covered their two recent meetings ('00 & '01) by only 10 & 11 but that was pre Tomey and Carroll was only in year 1 in '01. Tomey is 0-7 SU and 2-5 ATS on the road vs BCS schools. SJSt has a more winnable game next week vs Utah who finished #2 in the country last year which would be a HUGE feather in Tomey's cap. SJSt did generally outplay Nebraska on the road LY (353-315 yd edge) but did not cover. USC's avg home win in '08 was 36-3 and all 6 foes were from BCS leagues (3 ranked).

ARIZONA 31 C Michigan 21 - Last year Arizona had a game already under their belt when they played MAC member Toledo and rolled to a 41-16 win at home. UA was 4-20 as a HF but went 4-1 in '08. CM has 16 starters back from a team that has been to 3 straight bowls behind QB LeFevour. In his first year CM Coach Jones put zero effort into non-conf games vs BCS teams and lost by an avg of 55-14. Last year they upset Indy and played Purdue tough. Arizona has a 1st time starter at QB but only has NAriz on deck. The Cats do have 7 starters back on D (just 3 LY) but CM has the talent to put some points on the board.

UCLA 31 San Diego St 14 - Both of these teams made our Most Improved List and should be in bowls this year after a combined 6-18 record in '08. UCLA is in year 2 under Neuheisel and LY he had just 6 returning starters and they were learning new systems. SDSSt is 0-20-1 vs UCLA including being outscored by an avg of 23 ppg from '02-'05. The Bruins are 13-2 ATS in home openers and including bowls, UCLA is 7-2-1 ATS vs the MWC dating back to 2002. UCLA does have a big game at Tennessee next week and has no film to study with the new staff. SDSSt HC Hoke, new DC Long and new OC Borges (ex-UCLA OC) are switching schemes on a team that has a decent amount of talent returning including QB Lindley and a much improved defensive front 7.

Lsu 30 WASHINGTON 20 - While their last meeting was in 1983 it is interesting that an unranked LSU team en route to a 4-7 season upset #9 Washington at home 40-14 and now the roles are reversed. UW has long lost its once fabled home edge and is just 15-31 ATS in Husky Stadium but will be fired up for the first game with their new HC while LSU has their SEC opener on deck vs a bowl squad from '08. The Huskies have only had 3 non-conf BCS tms visit S/'04 dropping all 3 by an avg of 26 ppg. LSU did win their last trip to the West Coast getting past Ariz St in a game moved due to a hurricane. UW is one of the most improved teams in the country, catch LSU in a strange trip to the great Northwest (longest road trip in LSU history) and is healthy with returning QB Locker and should keep this closer than the oddsmakers think.

NEBRASKA 45 Florida Atl 17 - Last year Schnellenberger riled up Big 12 member Texas prior to their game and FAU was destroyed. We imagine he went to Lou Holtz school of PR this year and made the Huskers out to be the best team in the history of college football. He has gotten his team to a bowl the last 2 years by playing a lot of players on the road vs BCS foes and getting blown out but it gains exp for more winnable game. This year they have just 3 starters back on defense. While the Owls have the more experienced QB and do have the talent to stand up to the Huskers for most of the game it is a startling stat that



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makes this a no brainer: FAU has lost TWELVE in a row ATS on the road vs BCS conf schools with the avg loss 46-8! The Huskers are our pick to win the Big 12 North and only have Ark St on deck.

CLEMSON 33 Middle Tennessee 20 - This is a good spot for MTSt. Most folks will look at a 5-7 team who is losing their starting QB and not give them a chance. MT actually has an exp QB back in Dwight Dasher who is perfect for this type of game as if one player loses containment he can take it to the house with his legs. They are 4-2 ATS vs BCS conf schools and upset Maryland last year and nearly upset Kentucky and Virginia in that span. They are a veteran team with 15 sts back. Clemson is our pick to win the ACC Atlantic but to do so they need to beat GTech next week in their ACC opener and that game is in 5 days on a Thursday Night. There is no doubt Clemson is the stronger team (#35 off, #12 D units vs #87 and #97) but this will be a "C" game for them and an "A" game for Middle Tennessee.

TEXAS 51 Ulm 6 - The Longhorns have won 9 straight season openers by an avg of 49-6. Texas avg 521 ypg on offense at home LY and that includes Big 12 games and they have 9 starters back including QB McCoy. ULM is 14-6 as an AD including an outright upset of Alabama in '07 and they have 17 ret starters this year. Texas only has Wyoming on deck and their depth will wear down ULM and ULM has a young QB. UT also remembers that 2 years ago in the season opener they were outgated 427-340 and outFD'd by SBC foe Ark St.

TENNESSEE 37 Wku 6 - This is Lane Kiffin's 1st game as head man and he will want to impress the home crowd. UT has covered 3 straight home openers and the last time they were off a losing season they covered their opener by 20 and that was a game where they were a HD to Cal. This time, however, they have two huge games on deck with UCLA and Florida. WKU is a young team with just 11 starters back and a new QB. They have faced 4 SEC teams on the road since '05 and their avg loss is 44-9 (Bama 41-7 LY).

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Sunday, September 6th

Mississippi 34 MEMPHIS 20 - This is some rarefied air for Ole Miss which is in the Top Ten and getting a lot of national attention. These schools are just 85 miles apart and the dog is 4-2 ATS. While Ole Miss is 3-1 in their last 4 trips here they are 1-3 ATS and have been outscored by one point in those games. Ole Miss does have a bye on deck. LY Memphis had a 453-438 yard edge in their 17 pt road loss with their 188 yards rushing the most vs the Rebels all year. UM QB Snead hit 10-22 for 185 yds & 2 TD in his debut as the Rebels QB and it was Houston Nutt's first gm as HC.

COLORADO 41 Colorado St 17 - This game has been played in Denver in 9 out of the last 11 years but this is on campus in Boulder. Prior to last year the previous 6 had been tight down to the wire battles decided by a total of 25 pts but LY CU rolled to a 38-17 win. Colorado has one of the most improved rush offenses in the country and that will help them dominate here as CSU has just 13 career sts back on the D-line and loses their #2 and #3 tacklers from LB and last year allowed 190 ypg rush and 5.3 ypc. When you dominate the line of scrimmage you dominate the game and CSU has a QB making his first road start in a hostile environment.

LABOR DAY - Monday, September 7th

RUTGERS 30 Cincinnati 20 - Rutgers looked dead in the water last year at 1-5 but won their last 7 games including the bowl to go 8-5. They are a stronger team this year and now take on last year's Big East Champ at home with only Howard and FIU on deck. We rate the offenses even, give Cincy the edge on ST's (#11 vs #58) but a large edge goes to Rutgers on D (#51 vs #93) where Cincy has just 1 ret starter. Last year Rutgers only lost by 3 on the road. Cincy does have the more veteran QB but Rutgers has the Big East's best O-line which should help give their young QB and WR's some time vs the inexperienced Bearcat D. Cincy has won 3 in a row at Rutgers but is just 3-16 SU in their first road game and LY Rutgers D took on a Cincy tm avg 32 ppg on the road and held them to 13.

Miami FI vs FLORIDA ST - Last year's game was not as close as the final as FSU led 31-10 in the 3Q and had a 286-52 yard edge at Miami at the half. The underdog has amazingly won 6 of the last 7 outright! While FSU has won 3 of the last 4 SU they have been by margins of 3, 3 and 2. We actually give Miami slight edges on off and def and a decent sized edge on ST's (#4 vs #42). While both teams have similar numbers in terms of lettermen lost and starters returning our ratings have Miami a much more improved team as they relied on a lot of frosh and soph last year who are a year older. To Read rankings - YPC is yards per carry for each team's offense and defense. Turnover edge is the amount of turnovers that team is + or -. OFF YPP is offensive yds per point. This shows the avg amount of yds a team travelled per point scored. The lower the number the more efficient the off. DEF YPP is defensive yds per point. The higher the number here, the better the def is at making their opponents work at scoring points. The remaining columns show the team's rank in that category. Next to the passing ratings there may be a ★ or an X. On the offensive side a ★ means they are completing over 59% of their passes while the X shows that their QB's are completing less than 53%. Defensively, the opposite holds true as the ★ has that team's def holding its opp under 53% completions and the X shows that they allow over 59% completions.
