4★ MISSOURI over Texas A&M - After Mizzou won the L/3 SU as B12 foes, (5-1 SU/4-2 ATS, 3 outright upsets) A&M took the 1st as SEC opp's. LY MU needed a win to get to a bowl but was down to bkp QB Berkstresser (Franklin inj'd again) and it was not a contest as A&M scored TD's on their first 6 pass and led 42-0 with 3:33 left in the 1H. A&M is off huge game at LSU where they were dominated 34-10 (+5) getting outrushed 324-75 as Manziel, for the first time in his career, had a completion percentage lower than 50% going 16-41-224-1-2 and is now out of Heisman contention. Now he faces a Mizzou tm that is arguably a 4Q away (vs SC) of being the most complete tm in the country TY outside of Bama and FSU. LW they got back Franklin and they beat Ole Miss 24-10 (-2). They are now 9-2 ATS this year with 7 of their covers by DD's! They are +146 ypg at home TY while A&M is 0-3 ATS away on the road (-18 ypg). The Tigers also have a large D edge (#17-77) and the DL is fully capable of pressuring Manziel as they have 27 sks in SEC play alone and have forced a TO in 41 consec gms (FBS-best). Tigers roll into Atlanta!

FORECAST: MISSOURI by 14 over Texas A&M

3★ COLORADO ST over Air Force - AF has now beaten CSU 7 str yrs tying for the longest streak in series history ('83-'89). They are 5-2 ATS in that span and the visitor is also 5-2 ATS. Their streak will no doubt end this year as some are arguing this could be the worst tm in AF history at 2-9 getting outgained by 102 ypg. On the other side, this is the best Rams tm in a decade as they are sitting at 6-6 needing a win here to get to bowl elig. They are avg 38 ppg at home (+89 ypg) and now face an AF tm all'g 44 ypg (-171 ypg) in MW play. On the other side, while CSU all'd 459 (6.9) rush LY at AF, they hosted Cal Poly and 2 gms ago faced NM so should be much better prepared for the option and they all'd a respectable 240 ypg vs those 2 tms. Rams easily clinch bowl elig.

FORECAST: COLORADO ST by 24 over Air Force

OTHER SELECTIONS

2★ Ohio St over MICHIGAN - Prior to Jim Tressel taking over, Michigan had dominated the series but OST is now 10-2 SU/9-3 ATS and there has been just 1 outright upset the last 11 yrs. LY OST was playing for a perfect season at home and UM did not cross midfield in the 2H. We won with a 3★ LPS on the Buckeyes, 26-21 (-3). UM is 19-1 SU at home under Hoke and won their only game as a HD (+3 ND 35-31). However, that lone loss came in their L/HG to Neb and the Wolverines are just a fortunate FG vs NW away from coming in off 4 str losses. LW while the final score reads Iowa 24-21, the Hawkeyes completely dominated UM w/a 407-158 yd edge but suffered 4 crucial TO's. UM rush off is now avg a feeble 33 ypg the L/4 wks and now face a Buckeye D all'g just 95 rush ypg (2.9). In 2008-10 when a Top 10 OST tm played an unranked UM tm, they won by an avg of 22 ppg (L/2 yrs UM ranked). They get win #24 in a row here and move to 9-0 vs UM when having a real "HC" on the sidelines.

FORECAST: Ohio St by 17 over MICHIGAN

2★ Ulm (+) over LOUISIANA - These rivals are 30 miles apart and the visitor is 6-2 ATS and there have been 9 outright upsets the last 14 years. LY ULM was -9' at home and had 20,203 on hand, their 2nd largest crowd to see an SBC conf gm. We used UL as a Big Dog POW. ULM came in undefeated in the SBC, but UL piled up a 607-407 yd edge. ULM was int'd at the UL14 with 1:45 left and UL went for it on 4&6 on the last play of the game and got an 81 yd td pass for the 40-24 win which had to irk ULM HC Berry. UL's current 5-game win streak ties for longest in this series (4-1 ATS) UL is off a bye and has won 8 str gms after an 0-2 start. However, with that winning streak has come inflated lines and the Cajuns have failed to cover their L/3 incl 2 at home all laying 2 td's or more. Now they face a proud and talented rival that has already pulled 3 road upsets TY and this is the largest line in this series in the L/16 yrs.

FORECAST: Ulm (+) LOUISIANA by 7

OTHER GAMES

THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 28TH

TEXAS by 10 over Texas Tech - When TT HC Kingsbury was born Mack Brown was already in his 7th ssn of coaching and when Kliff was a Sr at TT (2002) he knocked off a 9-1, #4 ranked UT squad (Brown's 5th yr at UT and 18th ssn as a HC). Texas has now won the L/4 and 9 of 10. At home UT is 5-2 ATS with the non-covers a an 18 and 18' pt fav. This is TT's reg ssn finale while UT travels to Baylor. LY we used UT +6' on the road vs TT as the Big Dog POW and they delivered us another outright upset win. While TT had a 441-427 yd edge, UT had a 21-10 lead in the 2Q and 21-13 at the half. They got a td w/9:14 left to go up 31-22. LTH UT rolled to a 52-20 win (-14) as TT trailed 38-6 late 3Q and gained 47% (195) of their yds on their L/3 drives. While the Horns greatly disappointed us in their L/gm, they have won 6 of their L/7 gms while TT has dropped 4 str gms both SU/ATS by increasing margins (8, 18, 23, 29). Texas is 15-5 ATS in home finales and laid an egg last Thanksgiving getting upset by TCU and off a bye figure to make a much better impression in front of the national audience.

Mississippi by 3 over MISS ST - The home team is on an 11-2 SU/9-4 ATS run. LY Ole Miss needed a win to get to a bowl. They were -1 at home and dominated winning 41-24 with 257-333 yd edge. It was 17-17 at the half with UM getting a 76 yd td pass but the Rebels drove 50/11pl for a FG, 50/4pl for a td, 59 yds for a td and 87/11pl for a td and led 41-17 with 11:44 left. The LTH Ole Miss was a 17 pt dog and now they are a fav. The Bulldogs are 4-0 SU (3-1 ATS) at home in ssn ends vs Ole Miss covering the L/2 by 11 and 18' pts. After 4 str wins, Ole Miss ran into a healthy Mizzou tm and lost LW 24-10 (+2) as they were outrushed 260-126. On the other side, MSt was fortunate in their 24-17 OT win (-1) over Ark as the Hogs fmbld in the RZ w/less than a min left in regulation. In their last 11 trips here Ole Miss is 3-9 SU with only ONE win by more than a FG and we'll call for them just by that here as MSt is playing for a bowl.

FRIDAY NOVEMBER 29TH

NEBRASKA by 7 over Iowa - NU is 4-0 SU in this series. The Huskers' D has all'd just 14 FD/gm and 234 ypg in those 4 winning by an avg score of 29-9 per gm but it just 2-2 ATS. LY they were also playing on Black Friday and the wind was a major factor. Iowa had been eliminated from bowl contention and NU needed a win to get to the B10 Title game but finished with just a 263-200 yd edge. NU forced a punt and got 2 FD's ending the game at the U110 as they won 13-7 (-16). Neb is 7-0 SU/5-2 ATS in FHG incl 2-0 ATS in B10. Both tms come in off impressive wins as Neb beat PSt 23-20 in OT (+1) on the road while Iowa beat Michigan 24-21 (-5) at home. The Hawkeyes dominated the Wolves everywhere but the scoreboard as they had 21-10 FD and 407-158 yd edges but had 4 costly TO's. Two very similar tms but Iowa is just 2-6 ATS as an AD while NU is 9-4 ATS as a HF.

Toledo by 10 over AKRON - UT is 4-1 SU/3-2 ATS but the HT is also 4-1 SU/3-2 ATS. LY was their first meeting s/08 and UT was -19 at home and only had a 459-332 yd edge in the 35-23 win as we cashed with Akron as our Tue Night Marquee. Toledo is off its disappointing 35-17 loss (+3) to NIU where after leading 17-14 mid-3Q they were worn down in the final 20:00. The Rockets had a chance to have a comfortable lead early but couldn't get out of their own way with 4 TO's incl an int'd jump pass in the EZ. While at most places a 4-7 record may get you on the hot seat, at Akron, it gets you a much deserved contract extension as Bowden has done a tremendous job here (3-33 prev 3 yrs). The Zips have won 3 of their L/4 gms and have also played quite well against the likes of Mich, ULL and NIU only getting outscored by an avg of 5 ppg (-13 ypg). UT is 5-0 ATS off a loss under Campbell.

BALL ST by 31 over Miami, Oh - The visitor (only 76 miles apart) has now won an amazing 8 in a row SU and is 6-2 ATS with 3 outright upsets. LY BS was starting bkp QB Kelly Page who hit 11-21-137 but true frosh Kyle Kamman came in and QB'd the final 3 series. MU trailed 31-14 but got a td and a FG and then forced a punt with :45 left. However, MU fmbld the punt at their own 13 and BS took a knee. These 2 tms come in on opposite ends of the spectrum. 9-2 BS is just a misleading 48-27 (+7) loss to NIU as the gm was

tied at 27 mid-4Q. Despite a perfect 5-0 mark at home (39-23 avg score) they are only +56 ypg. Meanwhile, 0-11 (2-8-1 ATS) MU is arguably the worst tm in the country TY as they are getting outscored by 25 ppg and are -253 ypg. Away from home it's even worse as they are -316 ypg and. While BS should be able to name the score here, it should be noted that the largest MOV in the Lembo era has been 31 pts.

CENTRAL MICH by 21 over Eastern Mich - CM has been favored 12 str gms and prior to LY (-2) the prev 5 were all DD. CM is now 3-1 SU/ATS. The visitor is 8-3 ATS (6-2 SU) and there have been 5 outright upsets the L9Y. LY EM led 14-0 but CM outscored them 34-17 the rest of the game. LW we wrote that CM was in the same spot they were LY (finished 3-0 SU/ATS) needing to win out to get 6 wins vs the bottom tms in the MAC. We made the Chips our Early Bird POW (FREE every Mon at 347-677-1700) and the line moved 4 pts during the wk but it didn't matter in their 37-0 win (-13) over UMass. There have been feeble performances in CFB TY but EM might have had the worst off performance of the yr LW managing just 4 FD's and 65 yds in their 58-7 loss (+25') to BG. Their only td was a 10-yd IR. While the MI MAC Champ is on the line here and EM traditionally plays their fellow state opp tough, the Chips are clearly the play.

OHIO by 17 over UMass - LY Beau Blankenship carried 43x for 269 yds for OU, his 5th str 100 game but amazingly OU (-23') on the road, only won 37-34. QB Tetteleton was ? coming in and hit 15-27-229 but Mike Wegzyn hit 27-52-373. Bobcats are only 1-9 ATS as a conf HF. They are off a home game with 10 days rest while UMass is on the 2nd of B2B away with 6 days rest. Maybe OU didn't like playing on Tue Night as their L/3 gms (all on Tue) were abysmal performances losing by a combined score of 123-16. UMass is used to getting beat by those combined scores and LW lost to CM 37-0 (+13). You have to think there will be some changes on both coaching staffs next yr (OU coord and UMass possibly HC) and while OU should win the gm by 4 td's, the L/3 wks give us some hesitation.

MARSHALL by 7 over E Carolina - The HT is 6-1 SU but for the LBY they rotated a pair of covers w/ MU taking the L/2. MU (-2) beat EC 34-27 in OT last time here as EC came in banged up in what was a bowl elimination game for them. EC ret'd the favor LY as they eliminated MU from bowl contention 65-59 in 2OT (-6'). MU's 59 pts scored were the most ever in a loss. EC covered 1st 2 as conf AD under McNeill but since has gone 1-5 ATS. This is a short week for EC and B2B road (NCS) while Marshall has won their L/9 Nov HG's by 19 ppg. The Herd are a tremendous 5-0 SU/ATS at home TY outscoring their opp by 42 ppg (+252 ypg). CUSA East champ is on the line and keep in mind the L/ time the Pirates played a tm that had won more than 3 gms TY, they fell to Tulane (5 gms ago).

Bowling Green by 2 over BUFFALO - Ralph Wilson Stadium. The visitor has won 5 in a row SU (6-0 ATS run) incl 4 str outright upsets. LY BG moved their HG to Columbus and was -9' on the day after Thanksgiving and held UB to 24 yds in the 1Q and recorded 7 sks during the game. BG led 21-0 and UB got a 4Q td for the 21-7 final. BG has won their last 4 trips to UB by 20, 14, 1 and 14 pts despite not being favored in the last 3 (obviously this is a different site but same city). BG has 6 days rest while Buff has 10. The tms are remarkably similar crushing the likes of UMass, Kent, Ohio, Miami and EM with their only MAC losses coming at the hands of UT. However, BG has been more impressive outscoring those foes by an avg of 41-11 (+236 ypg) while UB is outscoring those foes 38-17 (+157 ypg). Also slight nod to Falcons who have the exp edge in playing in these MAC East champ gms and will want to atone for LY's missed opportunity.

LSU by 27 over Arkansas - While LSU has won B2B games, Ark is 3-3 SU/5-1 ATS in the series. LY Ark had been eliminated from bowl contention and LSU was still clinging to hopes for the SEC West so the Hogs figured to mail in after they got down. LSU was -11' on the road but Ark outplayed LSU with 24-16 FD and 462-306 yd edges in the 20-13 Tiger win. LSU was 2-16-1 ATS as an SEC HF but has gone 6-4 ATS in their L/10 incl LW's impressive 34-10 win (-5) over A&M as they outrushed the Aggies 324-75. Bielema and the Hogs deserved better LW as they were going in for the win but fmbld in the RZ w/under a min left in regulation and lost to Miss St 24-17 in OT (+1). It was their 8th str loss TY and 11th straight SEC loss. While LSU is the best 3-loss tm in the country, it should be noted they are just 1-8 ATS in their FHG but tough to play on an Ark tm that is on a 2-9 ATS run.

TROY by 14 over Texas St - First meeting s/00 when both were FCS Southland members. Troy is only 2-10 ATS as a conf HF the L4Y. Troy is fresh off a bye and in their home finale while TXSt is traveling on a short week. It's their 2nd road gm in 3 weeks and they are coming off their home finale. LW the Bobcats were destroyed by WKU 38-7 (+4') as they were outFD'd 22-10 and outrushed 321-21. QB Arndt had 3 int's in 5 pass attempts and was replaced by Jones who was 14-25-104-1-1. Troy is a head case tm but they are +72 ypg at home TY and are 4-1 ATS in their FHG while TXSt is getting outgained by 185 ypg on the road TY. After B2B losing ssn, the Trojans get to bowl elig.

FAU by 28 over FIU - They called this rivalry The Shula Bowl when they played at a neutral site in Miami. FAU had won 5 in a row SU/ATS in this series, 3x as a fav and the next 2 with outright upsets. FIU finally broke free in '11 winning 41-7 (-17) and LY Mario Cristobal seemed to take the rivalry more seriously than Carl Peleni did as Peleni said all games count the same and Cristobal went all out and got the 34-24 road win (+1'). It was the 3rd outright upset in 4Y in the series. FAU is off a bye and 2 blowout wins while FIU is on a 6th str gm off a blowout loss to Marshall and on 3rd away gm in 4 wks. The Owls have responded well to the firing of Peleni as interim HC Wright has led them to 3 str wins/covers. LW they rolled up a 55-10 win (-22) over NMSI as we cashed our top weekly LPS CTOT play on the OVER. They are +138 ypg at home and are playing for bowl elig while FIU is -269 ypg on the road TY, having failed to cover their L/3 and are just playing the ssn out.

UCF by 31 over Usf - Met for 4Y ('05-'08) with USF winning all 4 and covering the first 3. UCF is now 18-8-1 at Bright House as a HF after we cashed a Thur Night Marquee on them in their 41-17 win (-17) over Rutgers LW. They are now just 1 win away from clinching the AAC title and a BCS berth. New USF HC Taggart was 11-1 ATS on the conf road at WKU with the loss by one pt. However, just like Holtz found out before him, winning at USF is a different story as the Bulls are 2-8 after LW's 16-6 loss (+4') to SMU cashing a 3★ LPS on the Ponies. Frosh QB White after a solid debut now has a 1-6 ratio in the L/2 gms as UB has failed to score an off td in 5 gms TY. The Knights are 11-2 ATS as a 20-pt fav and easily clinch here.

Fresno St by 14 over SAN JOSE ST - Despite San Jose St's upset win in the last game ('11) Fresno is 16-2 in the series. The other loss was in '06 and the following year the Bulldogs won 30-0 (-13'). Fresno is off a bye and a home gm vs NM while SJSt is playing a 6th str wk and had to prep for the option LW and now faces the contrasting Bulldogs. These schools are only 152 miles apart and the Red Wave usually travels well here. LW the Bulldogs clinched a berth in the MW title gm w/a 69-28 (-33) win as Carr broke a schl-rec w/7 td passes and Fresno tallied an incredible 820 yds of offense, also a schl-rec. Even with the MW champ gm on deck, they still are playing for a BCS bid while SJSt will need to pull off an upset just to make it to a bowl after an 11-win ssn LY. They are off the gut-wrenching 58-52 3OT loss to Navy (-2) as we cashed a 3★ CTOT LPS on the OVER but SJSt did have a 600-478 yd edge. Battle of 2 NFL-caliber QB's but we like Fresno who is +180 ypg in MW play while SJSt is only +28 ypg.

WASHINGTON by 14 over Wash St - UW has been a fav each of the L/6 mtgs by an avg of 11 ppg. WSU has not only covered 3 but pulled 3 upsets covering by 17 LY, 10 in '08 and 13 in '07. LY WSU had the largest comeback in the 105 meetings of the Apple Cup and avoided a winless P12 season. The Huskies led 28-10 after 3Q's and after WSU had tied it, UW missed a 34 yd FG which sent it to OT. WSU won it there. UW is just 2-6 ATS in home finales but playing with legitimate revenge after blowing that big lead. Both tms are off impressive wins and both will be playing in a bowl for the 1st time s/02. The diff here is that UW is outscoring their foes by an avg of 42-15 (+181) in refurbished Husky Stadium (louder) and we always like going against tms after clinching bowl elig who haven't been to a bowl for a lengthy period.

HOUSTON by 10 over Smu - How do you score 72 and win by 30 yet get outgained by 172 yds? TO's. LY SMU was a 5 pt HD and won 72-42 benefitting from a +7 TO edge. Houston had won 6 straight prior and covered 3 right. Both of these tms have won multiple LPS and Key Selections for us TY and LW we used both. UH who had cashed 7 Key Selections dropped a HG to Cincy 24-17 while SMU cashed their 2nd str LPS in a 16-6 win (-4) over USF despite losing QB Gilbert to inj in the 1H (CS). Frosh QB Burcham led a couple of scoring drives but was only 9-18-11-1. While it is well noted that SMU is +74 ypg in AAC play while UH is -18 ypg, the possibility of a frosh QB making his 1st career start here and the fact that the Cougars are playing with legitimate revenge has us leaning with them here.

OREGON by 28 over Oregon St - The Ducks have won 5 straight and covered 3 straight. LY the Ducks had just lost their unbeaten season the week before in a loss to SU. It was the 4th time in series history both came in ranked but a 6-0 TO edge for UO was the key in their 48-24 (-9') win. The Ducks had been a covering machine under former HC Kelly and for the 1st part of TY but now they have failed to cover 4 of their L/5 gms. After getting new life in the P12, they squandered it completely LW in a 42-16 loss (-18') at Arizona. Now their P12, Rose Bowl, BCS and Mariota's Heisman hopes are mostly lost. Speaking of lost, the Beavers have lost 4 str gms after a dismal effort vs UW LW in a 69-27 loss (+1') where they even trailed 62-6 at one pt. QB Mannion has completely regressed to LY's form w/a 4-10 ratio in the L/3 gms after having a 30-3 ratio the 1st 8 gms. Tough to gauge what both tms' frames of mind will be here but the Ducks are more than capable of handing the Beavers another blowout loss.

SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 30TH

Boston College by 6 over SYRACUSE - Since last BE mtg in '04 only game was in '10, in which BC pulled a small road upset also in the ssn finale (+3', 16-7). An interesting note to that gm is that then frosh RB Williams got the start due to inj and had 42 carries for 185 yds. BC's Addazio got his first FBS cch'g job with Syracuse ('95-'98, OL/TE). Syr is off a home loss to Pitt needing a win to get to bowl elig while BC finishes with B2B away and 3 in 4 gms. Addazio would be getting ACC COY awards if not for Duke HC Cutcliffe as Addazio has taken over a 2-10 tm and has them 7-4 after their thrilling 29-26 win (-1') over MD LW. They continue to ride the nation's best RB Williams who became just the 16th plyr in FBS history to top 2,000 yds in a ssn. The Eagles were fortunate to get the win as K Freese was wide left on his first try from 52-yds out, but MD HC Edsall called a TO just before the kick. Given a 2nd chance, Freese made it. Both tms are similar as Cuse are -57 ypg in conf play while BC -44 ypg but the lean goes to BC winners of 4 str and having the best plyr on the field.

Maryland by 6 over NC STATE - The home team has covered 4 straight. LY MD was a 4' pt HD and had 22-17 FD and 462-347 yd edges. We used MD as the Underdog POW in PS and unfortunately QB Hills was OFY in the 2Q. It was a tough loss for MD. They led 18-17 and NCST fired incomplete with 1:13 left but MD punted. NCST got a 43 yd FG with :32 left but MD went 60/4pl with Rowe at QB but their GM 33 yd FG clanked off the left upright w/:02 left. NCST is 11-3-1 ATS as a conf HD s/07. It's been a season to forget for the Wolfpack under 1st yr HC Doeren as they have lost 7 str gms and LW were dominated by Little Brother EC 42-28 (+6'). MD after clinching bowl elig suffered a tough 29-26 loss (+1) to BC as HC Edsall wrongly called TO prior to a missed FG and on the 2nd try BC got the 52-yd game winner. Look for the Terps to rebound here as NCST is on an 0-6-1 ATS run and we expected a much better effort LW.

VANDERBILT by 14 over Wake Forest - 6th time in 7Y as both tms reg ssn finale. Vandy has won and covered B2B gms (41-7, -1', 55-21, -11') both at WF and the visitor is 5-1 SU/ATS. In '11 VU needed a win to get to a bowl and WF had already clinched a bowl spot. LY WF needed a win and VU had just clinched their bowl spot. TY WF has been eliminated from bowl contention while Vandy is trying to notch B2B 9-win campaigns. VU finally has a home field edge under Franklin as they've gone 13-6 SU/14-5 ATS incl 9-2 as a HF (6-14 ATS the prev 10Y). They are also 5-0 ATS as a DD HF LW they beat Tenn in consecutive yrs for the 1st time since 1920-26 as they got a td w/:16 left. Prior to the td, the gm looked to be over as UT stopped VU on 4th down but it shockingly got overturned by replay. WF had a great situational edge LW catching Duke off one of their biggest wins in schl hist while the Deacons were off a bye. They jumped out to a 14-0 lead but couldn't hold on in a 28-21 loss (+7). Not much to play here for WF and not much value w/Vandy already having wins over UGA, UF and UT TY.

NORTH CAROLINA by 7 over Duke - The last 2 times NC faced Duke with revenge was 1990 (+1, 24-22) and 2004 (-7, 40-17). They are now 21-2 the L/23. LY NC trailed by DD's in 4Q but up 4 all'd a 87/14pl GW td drive (5 yd pass) w/:13 left. In the L/9Y NC has been a fav of 7 or more every game but TY find themselves less than a td favorite despite coming in winners of 5 str gms and 6 str covers after LW's 80-20 (-17) win over ODU. The final could have been worse but the 4Q by mutual agreement of both head coaches was shortened from 15 min to 10. We've been saying for yrs that Cutcliffe is one of the most underrated HC's in the country and he is finally get some much deserved love TY while leading the Devils to a 9-2 record and 1 win away from an ACC Champ berth. LW they rallied from a 14-pt deficit to beat WF 28-21 (-7). However, it should be noted that in ACC play, the Blue Devils are -49 ypg and UNC is beating foes by 18 ppg at home. NC is the more talented tm, playing w/revenge and are laying a reasonable number despite being on one of the hottest ATS streaks in the country.

WEST VIRGINIA by 13 over Iowa St - LY WV, off 5 str losses, still needed a win to get to a bowl. Trailing 24-23, WV got a 75 yd td run to lead 31-24. WV is now 2-5 ATS as conf HF under Holgerson. The Mountaineers do have the situational edge as they are fresh off a bye and in their home finale (8-2 SU/4-5-1 ATS) while the Cyclones are playing for a 10th straight week and making their first ever trip to Morgantown. We get some added value here as in their L/gm WV was upset by Kansas 31-19 (-7) while ISt got KU off that big win (1st B12 win in 3Y) and embarrassed them 34-0 (-4') LW. What enhances WV as our pick here is the fact that they are +53 ypg while ISt is -253 ypg away from home.

Northwestern by 3 over ILLINOIS - In the L/5Y NW has gone 4-0 ATS when H or A with III covering the bizzaro Wrigley Field game. The Illini were favored the previous 6Y incl by 10 pts in '11 and there was a 29' pt swing w/NW -19' LY (NW largest B10 fav role ever). This is the 1st time in 6Y that Illinois finishes the ssn at home vs a conf opponent. Speaking of firsts, LW III picked up their 1st B10 win in 21 tries beating Purdue 20-16 (-6'). It could have been worse as they had a 22-11 FD edge but had 4 20's. Ill is 2-8 SU/4-6 ATS in home finales and 3-10 ATS vs NW, plus NW is 10-4 ATS in Nov AG's. The Wildcats do come in losers of 7 straight after a 4-0 start which prompted HC Fitzgerald to say LW, "The year '13 is over here in a week and good riddance. There's something about that number I don't like." This one, like most NW gms, will go down to the wire and we'll call for the Cats to avoid a winless B10 ssn.

INDIANA by 17 over Purdue - PU has been a fav in this series 11 str gms and has won and covered the L/2 and 4 of 5. LY we had a 3★ CTOT on Over 63. PU won 56-35 but it was closer than the final score. In fact, at the half IU had a 264-209 yd edge and led 21-14. It was 35-35 with 12:14 left in the game before PU scored the gm's final 21 pts. IU has lost 5 str home finales by 23 ppg but the home tm is 10-5 ATS in the instate rivalry game for the Old Oaken Bucket. IU is 2-1 ATS as a B10 HF but this is the 1st time they have laid 3 td's in a B10 gm since 1991. Their D is all'g 39 ppg leaving the backdoor open vs a PU offense that has made some strides particularly QB Etling who is completing 62% of his passes the L/3 wks (3-2 ratio) after comp just 47% (3-5 ratio) in his 1st 4 gms. Indy gets the win but this # is far too steep for our liking.

CONNECTICUT by 1 over Rutgers - The home team has won and covered 3 straight and 5 of 6 with 3 upsets in the L/4Y. LY RU was -7 at home. The FD's were even at 17 and RU only had a 280-244 yd edge but got a 25 yd IR td wtd with 3:44 left and won 19-3. Knights are in 2nd of B2B away and are a tm in turmoil w/4 DD losses in their L/5 gms. They are also dealing with a player/cch bullying story. LW we won a Thur Night Marquee going against them in their 41-17 (+17) loss to UCF. On the other side, Conn sitting at 0-9 on the yr and trailing 21-0 at HT shockingly rallied to beat Temple LW 28-21 (+7). Now they come back home where they nearly beat Mich, outgained USF by 128 yds and covered vs a top 20 LVille tm.

Tennessee by 7 over KENTUCKY - The Vols had won 26 str meetings vs UK but were upset in '11 10-7 (UK only 10 FD's) so LY were playing with legit revenge. They were also playing w/o their HC as Dooley had been fired and they had an interim HC while UK was playing their final game for Joker Phillips. Tenn only had a 457-412 yd edge. UK had a 324-234 yd edge and trailed 20-17 with 7:31 left 3Q but UT went 61 and 79 yds for td drives and added a 33 yd FG with 5:38 left for the 37-17 win. Both new HC's have had tough 1st yrs. LW UK, which traditionally plays UGA very tough was destroyed 59-17 (+26) despite the Bulldogs playing w/o QB Murray for the last 35:00. On the other side, UT has secured a 4th straight losing snr for the 1st time s/1902-06. LW they thought they had the gm won vs Vandy but a controversial overturned call gave the Dores new life and UT all'd a td w/:16 left in the 14-10 loss (-2'). Winner here gets some positive momentum in the offssn and we'll back the Vols.

MICH ST by 14 over Minnesota - Minny had covered 5 str prior to LY. The Gophers had already clinched a bowl and MSU was 5-6 needing a win. The Spartans flat out dominated with 421-96 yd and 21-7 FD edges. Kill was not on the sidelines for the 2H and MSU actually only led 16-10 in the 4Q before winning 26-10 (-8'). MSU was 30-6 at home in 1st 5 yrs under Dantonio and after a 2-5 yr LY have gone 6-0 TY. The last 2 times here MSU won by 23 (-24) and 7 (-27) but MSU is 1-3 ATS in

FHG's. While on the surface it would seem they have nothing to play for here after wrapping up the B10 Legends LW and with OSU on deck, they will be an attractive BCS at-large selection getting to 11 wins. Minny managed a cover vs Wisc LW thanks to a 39-yd IR td but overall was outgained 324-185. Much like vs Iowa earlier and LW, they face a bigger, stronger version of themselves here.

MEMPHIS by 10 over Temple - First mtg. This is Temple's ssn finale and it is also their 21st different venue in their L/21 games away from home. Both tms have shown improvement TY but it hasn't shown in the win column. Temple had covered 6 str gms and were leading UConn 21-0 at HT LW but loss 28-21 (-7) giving them their 5th loss TY of 7 pts or less. Meanwhile, Memphis has covered 3 str and LW put a scare into LVille in a 24-17 (+23) loss. Their D for the 2nd yr in a row is one of the most underrated in the country all'g 85 ypg less than what their opp are avg (#14) and they have the DL to contain Temple's mobile QB.

UAB by 14 over Southern Miss - SM had won 9 in a row SU in this series incl a 70-14 thrashing in '08. Evidently, UAB was embarrassed by that game as they have actually won the last 4 in a row both SU/ATS with all 4 being outright upsets of dogs of 9', 10', 23 and 3. SM appeared to finally have their first win in hand leading 16-0 at the half at home LY but UAB would outscore them 27-3 in the 2H. LTH ('11) SM was a 23 pt AF so a swing of 37' pts here. UAB went 2-2 ATS in conf HG in McGee's 1st yr but in their lone role of conf HF they lost 46-9. While they didn't get the upset LW, they have been competitive in each of their L/2 HG's losing by 3 to the likes of MT and Rice. The same can't be said for the SM who dropped their 23rd str gm LW but a small golf clap goes out to them for breaking their 7 str ATS loss streak in their 42-21 loss (+23). Tough to lay a ton of pts here w/a 2-9 tm but we do like they are actually outscoring their opp's at home TY.

South Alabama by 7 over GEORGIA ST - Series tied at 1-1, home team 2-0 SU. LTH ('11) GST never trailed but allowed a td w/:04 left forcing OT (GST still won 27-20). FHG for Panthers while Jags' have FHG vs UL on deck. It continues to be Heartbreak Hotel for the Panthers who LW had a 432-290 yd edge but lost 35-33 (+24) at KR St as they failed a 2-pt conv in the final minutes. It was their 4th loss TY by a td or less and despite an 0-11 record, they have covered 8 of their L/9 gms. The Jaguars know a thing or two about close losses as they have 5 by a td or less. After getting blown out by Navy, they had arguably their best performance of the ssn LW in a 36-14 (-3') win over ULM incl having 25-14 FD and 424-274 yd edges. However, they now are laying over a td on the road for the 1st time in schl history against a GST tm that has proven itself it can go toe-2-toe w/the better tms in the SBC despite not having an outright win.

UTAH ST by 21 over Wyoming - The Aggies dropped 4 str through '07 but won in '11. The 63 pts tied the '97 mark, which is the most s/61! The Aggies should be the fresher team as in the L/5 wks they have had 2 byes. After 4 str wins they are now are playing for a spot in the MW Champ gm next week. In the L/3W the Cowboys have been destroyed by Fresno and Boise and were taken to the limit LW vs Hawaii 59-56 (-6') and now travel. Christensen, however is in his money making spot, as WY is 17-5 ATS as an AD. However, this is arguably the biggest disparity in defenses TW as Utah ST boast our #19 D while WY is a pathetic #118. Late November, means we usually ride the more physical tm with the better D and while WY has backdoor potential w/QB Smith, the Aggies comfortably book a date w/Fresno ST next week.

UTAH by 17 over Colorado - In their 2 P10 meetings, CU has been +22 and +23' yet outgained Utah by 99 and 82 yds winning outright at Utah 17-14 and LY having a hard luck 7 pt home loss but still an easy cover. CU led 28-20 in the 4Q with Utah taking the lead with 8:39 left, 35-28 then each team getting a 100 yd KR td, 42-35 (8:12). CU was SOD at their own 45 with 5:33 left and int'd at the Utah 38 with :55 left. This is a great example of looking past the records as both tms come in 4-7 and 1-7 in P12 play. The difference is Utah has actually beaten the likes of Stanford and BYU w/near upsets of UCLA and Arizona ST while Colorado's best win came in the opener vs CST as their other 3 wins came against a 1-11 Cal tm and 2 FCS opp. Utah is -53 ypg in P12 but Col is -204 ypg. While CU has managed B2B easy covers vs the Utes, they are a paper tiger here taking on a Utah tm that boasts a #32-97 D edge.

Byu by 11 over NEVADA - Only mtg in last decade was in '10 when Nevada was a 4 pt AF winning 27-13. Wolf Pack do have an unusual bye prior to this ssn finale and FHG (5-1 ATS) but arguably had their best performance of the ssn in their L/outing picking up a 38-16 win (+7) over SJST giving us a NCSportsline Underdog POW outright upset winner (FREE every Tue at 347-677-1700). Meanwhile BYU finishes at Wisc, Idaho ST, at ND and here (3rd road in 4 wks, post-ND). We love playing against tms coming off ND (see Mich vs Akron and Pitt vs NC) as they treat the Irish like their Super Bowl but the even-keel Mendenhall usually doesn't have his tm amped up for any specific gm. We do like the fact UN QB Fajardo has thrown only 2 int's all yr and will playing a beat-up Cougar secondary that was missing 2 str's LW (CS). The only thing preventing us from making this a Key Selection is the fact that BYU has covered their last 10 off a SU loss.

RICE by 7 over Tulane - Rice is 4-1 SU but Tulane has covered the last 3. LY Rice was a 6 pt AF but Ryan Griffin was back at QB for TU and threw for 476 yds. Rice did have a 211-0 rush edge but we won with a 3★ LPS on Tulane +6. TU trailed 28-7 in the 2Q but rallied for a 38-35 lead with 2:55 left in the 3Q. Rice retook the lead and TU got a td with :56 left but the 2 pt failed and Rice won by 2. With NT's surprising loss to UTSA LW, the winner of this one now claims the CUSA West title and will be in the CUSA champ gm next wk. LW Rice barely survived in a 37-34 (-19) OT win over UAB. The Green Wave on the other hand snapped a 2-gm losing streak and crushed UTEP 45-3 (-16). It was the final scheduled gm at the Superdome for them where they have played HG's s/75. Both tms are in their preferred roles as Rice is 11-3 ATS as a HF but Tulane is 6-2 ATS TY as an underdog w/6 outright upsets cashing us many LPS winners. Now they are getting 2 td's despite their D giving up just 18 ppg in CUSA play TY. Rice gets the win but we'll gladly continue to ride the Wave here.

Georgia by 3 over GEORGIA TECH - UGA moved to 11-1 SU in this series and 8-3-1 ATS. The visitor is an outstanding 13-2 ATS even with a rare loss LY. UGA must love varsity hot dogs as they are 6-0 SU/ATS here. LY in the 1H GT held the ball for 21:24 and UGA only had a 254-238 yd edge but GT all'd about 19 yds per snap. UGA rolled 42-10 (-14') despite having the SEC champ game on deck. TY there will be no champ gm on deck for the Bulldogs (GT is still in mix for ACC) as they come in 7-4 after a shocking 59-17 win (-26) over UK. The reason it was shocking to us is because UGA was in a letdown spot off an excruciating loss to Auburn and they traditionally struggle with the Cats. However, they would probably trade that cover if it meant they could see their QB Murray one more time in uniform as he is now OFY (ACL) after 52 concave starts! GT HC Johnson needs this one but we won't overreact to Murray being out as Mason led UGA to 31 pts LW.

Virginia Tech by 13 over VIRGINIA - Frank Beamer has dominated this series as he is now 13-1 SU/10-4 ATS and has won 9 in a row SU by 20 ppg (7-2 ATS). VT has also won and covered 4 straight trips to Charlottesville covering by 22 ppg. VT has the edge of a late season bye as UVA's L/4 gms are Clem, at NC, a bye, at Miami and VT (4 of the ACC's best). LY VT needed a win to qualify for a bowl and had a dominating 23-7 FD edge but needed a FG with :04 left to pull out the win, 10-7 (-14). LTH VT won 38-0 (-5). It's quite simple for the Hokies: A win here and a UNC win over Duke puts them in the ACC champ AT. In their L/4 gms, they have shockingly lost 3 all as a fav despite being +97 ypg in those contests. At 2-9 UVA HC London could use a win to keep him 100% safe for next yr (owed a lot of \$). The reality is VT is in a must-win situation, offer a bye, Beamer owns the series and they have a D edge (#15-62).

Alabama by 13 over AUBURN - This could be arguably the biggest Iron Bowl gm in history as the winner here goes to the SEC champ gm. LY was the most lopsided (49-0) Iron Bowl s/48 (55-0) and it could have been worse except Saban played subs much of the 2H as Bama had the SEC Champ game on deck. Bama scored td's on their first 7 poss. New Auburn HC Malzahn was, of course, the AJ OC from '09-'11 and the 28-27 win at Bama in '10 was the most Bama allowed at home in a 35 gm stretch until A&M LY. Auburn has not scored an off td in the L/2G. It may seem hard to believe after LY but Aub had actually won 6 in a row SU in this series from '02-'07. Bama is 4-1 SU/3-2 ATS with that one loss being Aub's National Champ yr. Three of their wins have been by 36, 28 and 49 points and have covered the L/2Y despite being -21 and -34'. Malzahn did inherit a talented roster that he mostly recruited but it still doesn't diminish the job he has done taking a 3-9 tm and turning it into 10-1. They have been fortunate in many of their gms TY (5 wins by 8 or less) and none more so than their L/one vs UGA as their 4&18 prayers were answered. They have covered 8 str gms which gives us a little bit of value here. No doubt, the gm falls on the shoulders of QB Marshall who is still unproven as a passer and will be taking on a Bama defense that has allowed only 50 combined pts in their L/9 gms! On the other side of the ball, the Tide OL has all'd just 2 combined sks in the L/7 gms. While Auburn has been a nice story this ssn, Bama has been "THE" story of CFB for the L/5 yrs and continues their quest of cementing themselves as the greatest dynasty in CFB history.



UNDERDOG PLAY OF THE WEEK

Over 32 years this play has been a reader favorite hitting 214-162. The last 14 years the Underdog Play of the Week has recorded numerous **OUTRIGHT UPSET WINNERS (50!) to the incredible record INCLUDING 4 TY including 3 straight outright winners!!!!** Here is TW's Underdog Play:

PITT (+3) over MIAMI, FL

- Have only played once since the final BE matchup ('03). UM has won 15 of 16 and 7 str by 22 ppg (5-2 ATS). In '10 Miami was ranked #19 coming off a loss and we used them as our Marquee Sept GOM and they dominated at Pitt (-3', 31-3). LW Pitt clinched bowl elig w/a 17-16 win (EQ) over Cuse while Miami stopped a 3-gm losing streak w/a 45-26 win (-20') over UVa. The gm was misleading as they were outgained 483-304 and they have still failed to cover 6 str gms. It is almost an automatic to go against the Canes in the cold as recent gms have included a 20-14 Champs Bowl loss to Wisc as a 3' pt fav, a 33-17 Sun Bowl loss to ND as a 2.5 pt fav and LY in Chicago they were destroyed by the Irish 41-3 (+14). The final stamp is the fact Miami is traveling on a short week and Pitt is 4-1 ATS in their FHG and have already beaten ND at home TY. BRRRRRR!

FORECAST: PITT by 6 over Miami, FL

BOISE ST by 31 over New Mexico - LY BS travelled to NM and the Lobos almost pulled the outright upset as a 25' pt dog. We used NM as a 3★ Key Selection in PS, a 4.5★ PP, a Big Dog POW and finally our #2 LPS, a strong 4★ selection. The 1H was frustrating as NM fumbled on their opening drive in BS terr, had an 11pl drive end in a punt and another 13pl drive end in a fmb. BS had td plays of 50 and 71 yds and actually led 25-0 at the half. NM cont'd to battle in the 2H and got a td with 7:39 left to pull to 32-29 then dropped an int, which would have been ret'd for a td. Boise is 7-3 ATS in home finales and the 3-non covers were 45-0 (-48'), 29-7 (-38') and 42-7 (-46'). Boise did play the AF option back in Sept so probably spent more time preparing for it than in recent yrs. NM is playing a 5th straight wk and are on B2B road. They are also playing w/o their stg QB and RB who are OFY. It's been a disappointing ssn to say the least for Boise as they lost their 4th gm LW to SDST. They have one of the biggest home/away dichotomies in the country TY as they are +26 ppg and +216 ypg at home and are -5 ppg and -70 ypg on road. Now they will be taking on a NM D all g 49 ppg and 570 ypg in conf play TY.

Baylor by 10 over TCU - Baylor 18-1 SU at home L3/Y with the only loss to TCU LY. TCU is 4-1 SU/ATS in the series and LY BU turned the ball over 6x. The Bears were favored for the first time in 6 gms vs the Frogs and TCU QB Boykin in his 2nd start, had 4 td passes. These rivals are just 100 miles apart but LY was their first league game s/95. TCU is 12-2 SU/9-5 ATS in home finales and for only the 2nd time in the Patterson era will not be heading to a bowl as this will no doubt be their Super Bowl as they come in off a bye. LW the Bears could not handle the big stage and were blown out 49-17 (-8') at OSU getting outgained 594-453 with a lot of their yds coming late. They are now only outscoring their foes by 8 ppg on the road and could be suffering from Bubble Burst here as not only are there Nat'l Title hopes down the drain, their B12 and Petty's Heisman hopes took a serious blow.

Florida St by 28 over FLORIDA - The fav won and covered 5 straight before LY. FSU was -7 at home and had the ACC title game on deck but the Seminoles suffered a 5-1 TO deficit. FSU led 20-13 and it was 20-16 when EJ Manuel was crushed and fmb'd at the FSU37. UF got a 37 yd td run on the next play, drove for another td and a 30-20 lead and got the win, 37-26. UF is now 7-2 SU/6-3 ATS in the series. LTH FSU led 21-0 grabbing 4 UF int's (just 24 yds of off for 21 pts). FSU won 21-7 despite just 95 yds and 7 FD's! Both are basically off an FCS foe (FSU-Idaho) but with disparate results as FSU incredibly covered as a 57 pt HF 80-14 while the Gators lost to an FCS foe for the 1st time s/1946. UF all'd 429 yds in a 26-20 loss (-28) to Ga Southern. We thought Muschamp deserved another yr considering the sked and the injuries but there's no excuse for LW's performance. This will be the largest line in the series going back at least 25 yrs and that could have us fading the Noles here a bit vs our #8 D (no line as of press time). However, FSU is 9-1-1 ATS TY all as a DD fav and has covered 6 gms TY higher than this number.

Kansas St by 21 over KANSAS - IT'S SIMPLE - If Bill Snyder is the HC at KSU we'll back him in this series. While he's NOT perfect nothing wrong with a record of 15-1 SU/ATS. In the L3 gms KSU has avg'd 58 pts and while they were fav's of 3, 10 and 25 they still covered by 49, 28 and 15. LY KU had a 263-218 yd edge at the half but missed a 24 yd FG and trailed 21-14 but lost 56-16. Now, we have an even more motivated team after a home loss to OU (22-4 SU Home, 4-0 ATS after covering by 22 ppg) with a defense that just allowed a season high in points and yards. Kansas meanwhile has an offense which is avg 13 FD/gm in B12 play, is off a demoralizing shutout and has been outgained in every FBS game TY and is getting outscored by an avg of 38-15 in conf play. Sometimes a lot doesn't have to be said and this is definitely one of them.

WISCONSIN by 31 over Penn St - You've been to the Rose Bowl for 3 straight years yet your HC leaves for an SEC job. How do you recover? You hire a very smart HC in Gary Andersen who understands the brutal force Badgers rush attack and you play out the season. Now you are in your FHG, you only have 2 losses both on the road. One to a potential Nat'l Champ, which you outgained by 9 yards and to Arizona St who will be in the Pac-12 Champ and you only lost because of a bizarre grounding play. Your team is 6-0 SU/ATS at home avg 7.7 ypc and you're playing a team that is worn down due to scholarship losses and has only faced one winning team away from home allowing 686 yards and 63 points in that gm. Add in pay back for a 24-21 OT loss LY as well as having a defense that has held 3 foes to season lows and 3 more to their 2nd lowest total this year. Oh yeah, you're also facing a team that has a freshman QB that wants to throw but it'll be awfully hard against a D that is allowing a mind numbing 44.9% comp at home. Badgers fans will be jumping for joy.

UTSA by 13 over La Tech - A quick look at the standing shows UTSA a gm behind Rice who they already lost to. But, not so fast, as the Roadrunners actually hold the tiebreaker if Tulane knocks off Rice. UTSA is now playing their first "crunch time" game after the program played its inaugural game just 2 years ago but they are led by a Nat'l Champ HC in Larry Coker. The Roadrunners have also reeled of 4 str wins including giving N Texas their first home loss TY outgaining them 458-334. La Tech will clearly be motivated to play the role of spoiler, but this season hasn't gone as expected especially on the road where they are 2-4 SU beating only a 2-9 UTEP squad and a 1-9 FIU team. So far in their young history, UTSA has handled the role of a favorite going 6-0 SU/5-1 ATS but this will be their first ever DD fav's role. Nerves are clearly an equalizer and this LT team did have 3 int's LW and in the 5 games when they are E or plus in TO's they are 3-2 SU outgaining those foes by 44 ypg.

NEW MEXICO ST by 7 over Idaho - While GameDay decided to head to Alabama these 2 new HC's know just how much this season ending win would be for these 1-9 teams. New Mexico ST opened as 4' pt fav and not only is this their first time in that role TY, their avg line as a dog has been +23 pts. Idaho, meanwhile has been a single digit dog once TY, which was at home vs Temple, a game they not only covered but won 26-24 as our Underdog POW on these pages. On the season these two have similar numbers with the Vandals getting outgained by 180 ypg vs the #54 schedule with the Aggies getting outgained by 174 ypg vs the #65. With neither tm accustomed to the fav's role it's no surprise the dog is 4-1 ATS but Idaho has won 4 of the L5 SU. The difference in this one is an Aggies offense that prior to LW on the road was avg 449 ypg their prev 5 vs a Vandals off that hasn't topped 390 yards or 24 points in any game away from home.

San Diego St by 3 over UNLV - The Aztecs travel to Sin City off an upset vs Boise ST giving them a 4th straight win thanks to a D that held the Broncos to a ssn low 297 yds. SDST came into this season winning and covering 3 straight conf road games and have continued that streak going 3-0 SU/ATS TY and that includes 4 outright upsets but this is their 3rd road trip in 4 wks. A concern for Aztec backers is a different mentality on the road as they have gone 1-2 ATS as an AF lacking the killer instinct as combined they won by a total of 24 pts incl one in OT. UNLV, meanwhile reached 6 wins by doing what

they should, beating every team they were favored against while also knocking off AF as a 1' pt dog last Thursday. The Rebs came into TY 10-3-1 ATS as a HD but with the recent success they are 1-1 TY losing both outright. Only 2 teams have rushed for 200+ on SD 1 and they failed to cover both and with the Rebels avg 186 ypg they have a chance to prove they are for real.

WKU by 3 over Arkansas St - The visitor has actually won all 4 meetings SU and WKU is 4-0 ATS. LY WKU was -2' on the road and it was the tale of 2 halves. In the 1H, AST led 13-0 with a 212-114 yd edge and then WKU lost QB Jakes for the 2H and had to go with rFr James Mauro. Taggart was 0-13 as a HC when trailing at HT while Mauro hit 8-12-104 yds, WKU had a 26-0 edge in the 2H and 251-123 yd edge with WKU RB Antonio Andrews rushing for 215 yds. AST is playing a 3rd road gm in 5 wks while WKU is in their home finale and had a bye two weeks ago. Both tms come in on win streaks and you have to think the winner here gets the other SBC bowl bid in addition to UL. While AST has won 4 str gms, their 3-gm cover streak came to an end LW as they were nearly upset as a 24-pt HF to Ga St 35-33. Combine that with WKU's impressive 38-7 win (-4') over Texas St and you get some added line value. The top for us comes w/the fact AST has gone 9-0 ATS as a SBC dog while WKU is 0-6 ATS as a SBC HF. This goes down to the wire.

North Texas by 3 over TULSA - These two have met 4 times S/05 (Tulsa 10-0 SU series) with Tulsa winning all 4 and covering 3. In the last game, Tulsa led 41-3 thanks in part to 2 IR td's. Tulsa put the offense away and NT got a backdoor cover w/ 3 4Q td's. LW the Mean Green greatly disappointed us as they came in w/5 str wins/covers, were a perfect 5-0 SU/ATS at Apogee Stad TY and were 7-1 ATS as a HF under McCaerney but that all came crashing down and their CUSA Title hopes for that matter in a 21-13 loss (-7') to UTSA. They still have their 1st bowl appearance s/04 on the horizon, but must face a Tulsa tm that is more than capable of taking adv of their Bubble Burst here. The Golden Hurricane have not given up on the ssn and have actually cashed 2 str incl LW's 24-14 (-3) at LT.

MIDDLE TENN by 20 over Utep - First meeting, MT is on a 5-9-1 ATS run as a HF but did beat FIU 3 wks ago 48-0 (-18'). MT is off a bye and a trip to S Miss where they won 42-21 (-23). UTEP, meanwhile has brutal finish as this is their 2nd on B2B away and 5th road gm in 6 wks. LY the Red Raiders were sitting at home for the holidays at 8-4 in the SBC but TY w/a win here, they would be moving up the expanded CUSA bowl pecking order at 8-4. Utep was destroyed by Tulane 45-3 (+16) LW and have now failed to cover 8 of their L9 gms. They are -168 ypg on the road. MT gets another comfortable win here but UTEP's recent ATS losses has this number inflated.

SOUTH CAROLINA by 3 over Clemson - In the L10Y the line in this game has been 3.5 or less 9 times and 5.5 the other. Despite what Vegas thought SC has not only won and covered 4 straight but they've won by 17.5 ppg and covered by 17.6 ppg. LY Spurrier and Swinney took shots at each other in the media, mostly instigated by Spurrier and CU was at home -3' and appeared to be their healthiest all season. SC was down to bkp QB Dylan Thompson and trailed 14-7 in the 1Q and 14-10 at the half but then shut down CU in the 2H. Both are off FCS home games where they won easily but SC could have the SEC Champ gm on deck. Clem is 6-2 as an AD under Swinney. Coming into last weekend we thought we would be leaning with the Gamecocks here due to recent series history but it looks like Vegas has overcompensated. We think the tms are very close talent wise w/Clem having the off edge (#5-23) and SC having the D edge (#16-31). We'll lean with the Tigers here getting more than a FG.

USC by 10 over UCLA - USC had won 5 straight and covered 3 straight before #17 UCLA knocked off #21 USC LY. It was only the 3rd time both have been ranked s/93 (also '05 & '02). LY it rained for the first time in the series s/61 and UCLA was +4 at home and pulled the outright upset, 38-28. This used to be the one of the best rivalries in college football but USC turned it one-sided and went 12-1 SU from '99-'11 and put the cherry on top with a 50-0 wipeout in '11 which helped make USC the preseason #1 team LY and get Rick Neuheisel fired. These 2 sch'l's are separated by 12 miles and surprisingly the HT is 12-4 ATS. It's amazing what a different attitude can bring as a month ago UCLA might have been coming in here as a td plus favorite but now with the Trojans resurgence under interim HC Orgeron USC is a deserved favorite here. Thanks to UCLA's 38-33 loss (+2) LW to ASU, this gm does not have any meaning in the P12 South, but still has plenty at stake for both tms not only for this yr (bowl pecking order) but in the future as well (recruiting). UCLA is a young tm st'g a couple of frosh on the OL and are now taking on a USC D all g just 14 ppg at home. USC is also +31 ypg in P12 play while the Bruins are -29 ypg. Trojans continue their hot streak under Orgeron and get to 10 wins.

STANFORD by 14 over Notre Dame - The home team is 4-1 SU/2-2-1 ATS. LY Stanford was a 7 pt road dog in pouring rain. ND had a FD at the SU13 but ran 3x and settled for a 22 yd FG with :20 left to force OT. The Irish got a td then on 4&1 SU's RB Taylor was stopped then spun loose and got the td, however, they ruled progress had been stopped for a very controversial ending and they will be out to avenge that. SU is just 4-7 ATS as a HF LY but they're 4-1-1 ATS in their FHG. Cardinal finish w/Oregon, at USC, rival Cal and ND and now thanks to Oregon's loss LW have the P12 Champ gm on deck. Irish have gone 4-2 ATS as an AD under Kelly. It incl upsets at USC (+4', 20-16), #10 Mich St (+6, 20-3) and at #8 Okla (+12', 31-13) with one of the losses here in '11. Both tms have played USC and ASU and the Irish are actually 2-0 SU/ATS (-19 ypg) while Stanford is 1-1 SU/ATS (yds even). They key matchup will be a beat-up ND front 7 (all'd 200+ rush yds in 3 of L4 gms) vs that powerful Stanford ground attack avg 204 ypg.

ARIZONA ST by 10 over Arizona - The home team has now lost 4 in a row SU (4-16-1 ATS) with the visitor pulling the outright upset 3 str yrs. In those 4Y the home team, despite losing, has actually had the yardage and FD edge each time. LY AZ had a 36-24 FD and 522-460 yd edge but a blk'd punt and an int set up ASU for 8 and 2 yd td drives. AZ led 27-17 but AST pulled the upset 41-34. ASU is 8-3 ATS as a HF under Graham. Both tms are off arguably their biggest wins in at least a decade as Zona upset #5 Oreg in a 42-16 rout (+18') while ASU clinched the P12 South Champ w/a 38-33 win (-2') over UCLA. While on the surface, you would think this gm doesn't mean much to the Sun Devils, you'd be wrong as a win here will actually get them to host the P12 Champ gm next wk, which is a huge difference considering they were dominated at Stanford earlier TY. Zona is actually +83 ypg on the road while ASU is a dominating +173 ypg at home. ASU is the better tm but this is a visitor series.

HAWAII by 7 over Army - Only trip longer to a USA stadium was BC to Hawaii ('96). Army however has 2 byes prior and a bye after. Rainbow Warriors playing 6th str wk and off 3 away in 4 gms. Ellerson started his coh'g at UH as a GA ('77), then ret'd as a ST ch ('81-'83) before becoming the DC ('87-'91). Hawaii did face Navy's option 3 weeks ago. It's been Heartbreak Hotel for the UH who are now 0-11 this year and are trying to avoid going winless for the first time since 1998. They have lost 5 gms by a td or less incl B2B OT losses. However, this is by far the weakest tm they have faced all yr (8 prob bowl tms and other 3 will just miss out). LY in their L2 HF's they faced 2-win UNLV and S Alabama tms and easily won both. Now we'll call for them to get that 1st "W" of the yr.

4★ NY JETS by 13 over Miami - Rex Ryan is not one to hide his emotions and it's no secret that the only team he despises more than NE, which he is almost beat twice TY and the Jets outgained them 701-527, is MIA. In their last matchup NYJ WAS embarrassed as a week of trash talking with MIA led to 30-9 home loss. Ryan has now lost 6 div HG's and the next time he has earned revenge for his Vegas backers each time going 5-0 ATS covering by 8 ppg. NYJ have also won 4 of 5 at home knocking off NO and NE in their last 2. Now the Dolphins face cold weather off B2B upset home wins and on the road are where they are avg 79 ypg & 3.5 ypc rushing putting that much more pressure on Tannehill who has a 11-15 ratio and has been sacked 10.2% when on the road. Ryan's D dialed up 12 sks in their first 2 HG's vs div foes BUF and NE and expect the same here.

3★ BUFFALO by 7 over Atlanta (Toronto) - The Bills have grown used to home cooking as the host in BUF games is 9-2 ATS. While the annual trip to Toronto is a Bills home game they are 1-4 SU/ATS Up North with the win coming in '11 when they were also off a bye. ATL showed a bit of a spark in Thurs Night loss to NO but have still lost 5 straight and while they covered it was only their 2nd in 9 games. While not fans of laying points with a 4-7 team that is a chalk for the first time this season they clearly are playing hard for their 1st year HC and despite playing the #2 schedule over the L4W have outgained those teams by 37 ypg. ATL's heart, or lack of it, was obvious in LW's national TV game as they led by 1 at HT, scored last and had momentum into the 3Q and were shutout. BUF upset a better defense prior to the bye minus their top 2 WR's who return and the extra rest means fresh legs for Spiller vs the #29 rush def on the road.

OTHER SELECTION

2★ Arizona by 1 over Philadelphia - In contrast to the offense it's the first time S/O3 that PHI has held 7 straight foes to 21 pts or less. PHI has won and covered 5 of 7 which propelled them into 1st going into their bye. ARZ also has playoff hopes and after 4 straight wins they are in striking distance and they can thank their D. The Cards' D rank #9 despite playing 6 offenses that rank in the top #14 while in their L4 they have all'd only 260 ypg/15.5 ppg. The game pits the Eagles #1 rush attack with McCoy already over 1,000 yds (4.7) while adding 399 yds (11.7) receiving vs the NFL's #2 rush D which is only all'g 3.4 ypc. Foles has already mastered the play action and going into their bye his 3 game rating is second S/O6 in the history of the NFL throwing for 71% with a 10-0 ratio while also having a 16-0 ratio on the season! Impressive, but the Eagles L/4 opp's had D's that rank #28, #18, #17 and #32. PHI is 1-5 ATS as a HF TY and ARZ is outgaining foes on the road TY which includes trips to NO and SF. Higher powered offenses need 1.5 Qtrs to get in the groove after a bye (see DET) and we'll call for the road team with momentum on D to make it interesting.

TURKEY DAY SPECIAL

Green Bay at Detroit - DET is 0-9 SU and 0-8-1 ATS getting the Push LY vs HOU on Thanksgiving. Instead of a festive holiday week DET is off B2B upset losses and their 4th this season. Stafford's 4 ints and (more importantly) their loss to a 2-win team along with the Packers come-from-behind OT tie has the NFC North with a 2-way tie and GB just half a game back. The Lions have the added pressure as they already lost the first meeting with GB (+7, 9-22) which brings the series losing streak both SU & ATS to 5 games. With Rodgers potentially returning we'll have to pass but it will be part of our very special Thanksgiving Exec Club Package.

DALLAS by 13 over Oakland - This is arguably the worst situational spot for '13. This is OAK's 3rd road game in 4 wks, 3rd game in 11 days with a raw QB at the helm vs DAL (10-5-1 ATS as T-Day HF) who are just 2 weeks off a bye. Coaching staff's on byes take time to prep for their next two when they return and DAL has a clear edge with this being Garrett's 4th go around here. Romo is avg 297 ypg (68%) with a 13-4 ratio at home TY (4-1 ATS) and he's getting the #25 pass def allowing a 21-7 ratio minus 1st Rd DC Hayden who was put on IR LW. DAL's status as a "public team" does inflate lines and it's been noted that they are 1-7 ATS as a fav of 7 or more which would be a concern with a D that's given up 500 yds four times TY. This is one of the few games where an opposing offense lacks the skill players to challenge DAL's #31 pass D and we'll take the home team used to the short week here.

UNDER the Total - Pittsburgh at Baltimore - Both teams trail CIN by 2 games so this is clearly an AFC North elimination game. PIT moved to 7-3 ATS in the series holding off BAL (-1, 19-16) in the first meeting TY which was the 8th time in 10 meetings that the game was decided exactly by a FG. Both teams are of physical efforts vs defensive squads as PIT was outgained vs CLE on the road 367-302 in their 27-11 win while BAL shutdown the Jets 19-3 finishing with a 312-220 yard edge. This series has an interesting O/U log as since 2008 in their 11 meetings they have gone 5-5-1 O/U yet the combined score has NEVER topped 43 points. Both teams are hovering around the top 10 rank on D, have DC's that know how to shut down their rival and play conservative in these divisions game has us calling for the UNDER.

OTHER GAMES

CAROLINA by 17 over Tampa Bay - The fav improved to 5-1 ATS as CAR mauled TB 31-13 on Thur Nite TY with Newton connecting for 221 yds passing (72%) and 2 td's with another 50 yds/td on the ground. CAR escaped LW with a 20-16 win at MIA, but we'll consider it a positive in a massive letdown situation off SF and NE while having to battle from a 16-6 HT deficit. TB pulled off their 3rd straight win and 2nd straight upset and we'll gladly grab the value playing against them here after their explosive 24 point outburst with 10 FD's and 229 yds (+5 TO's). The Panthers #3 def will stifle rookie Glennon as they held the Bucs to 297 yards in their first meeting and now become the first team to face him a 2nd time. This is the 1st time the rookie QB is traveling B2B week and while it's two completely different scenarios Glennon did play in B2B road games 3 time at NC St throwing for only 54% with a 6-4 ratio going 0-3 ATS. First DD role for Panthers since '08 but with Newton, Carolina's L6 home wins have by 17 ppg with their upset over NE the only that hasn't been by DD.

CLEVELAND by 10 over Jacksonville - Imagine CLE's frustration as they have now outgained PIT, CIN, KC, DET and MIA by 52 ypg and lost each game (-10 TO's). The only QB that can stay healthy is Weeden who has only completed 53% with a 5.9 ypg and a 5-6 ratio and has no pocket presence taking a sack 10.7% of the time he passes. Now they are a fav of 7 or more for only the 5th time S/O9 and if the line climbs they've only been a DD fav just one other time (2007 SF 11.5 pt HF). JAX is coming in off their second straight road win but this is their 3rd away in 4 weeks. Weeden aside, CLE has just faced def's that rank #14, #6, #13 and #12, are 7-2 ATS after facing the Steelers and now host a warm weather team with the #28 defense. JAX surprised everyone with a 13-6 road win LW. However, the HOU D is still physical and the week following a win in Reliant, SEA lost by 6 as a 3 pt fav, STL lost by 15 as a 7 pt dog, IND lost by 30 as an 8 pt fav and OAK lost by 4 to TEN LW. We'll call for the home team by 10 in a lower scoring game for now.

INDIANAPOLIS by 4 over Tennessee - The dog is 5-1-1 ATS in the series with IND needing a patented 4th Qtr comeback just 2 weeks ago for the win. Fitzpatrick is in a groove with 269 ypg (72%) and a 5-0 ratio since stepping in for Locker and he now gets the #20 pass def that has all'd 293 ypg (65%) with an 12-1 ratio the L6W. The Colts issues there are forcing too much pressure on Luck behind an OL that Pagano has openly criticized due to its lack of punch on the ground. TEN's #11 D is only allowing an 8-9 ratio TY and they have started to get the run game going with 3 games of 114 or more in the L4W. The Titans actually hold the #6 seed due to tiebreakers and are under the radar here with the pressure being on IND who have CIN on deck with big seeding implications.

Denver by 13 over KANSAS CITY - DEN improved to 5-2 ATS in the series after the 27-17 win 2 weeks ago as a 7 pt HF on SNF. While a SNF trip to NE and playing a second straight away on a short week would bother most teams this is a Manning run machine. Now Peyton gets to game plan vs the same schemes' although this time it is probably vs the Chiefs D without LB's Hali and Houston who were the #1 and #7 tacklers in the first game, are the #7 and #4 tacklers on the season and are TWO of NINE NFL players with 9 or more sacks this year. KC followed up their bubble burst with a second straight loss and the Chiefs D which hadn't allowed over 17 points prior to DEN's 27 allowed 41 pts to SD and has now allowed 463 ypg the L/3. Bronco's have now won 17 of 18 regular season games, have covered 16 of their last 21 and if their off a loss to NE they've gone 3-0 SU/ATS the week after winning by an avg score of 39-17 and covering by 16 ppg. DEN should all but lock up the AFC West here and get a boost with John Fox returning mid-week to the facility.

MINNESOTA by 3 over Chicago - CHI is 6-2 ATS in the series failing to cover the 1st meeting 31-30 as a 6 pt HF. They are off meetings vs 3 physical defenses and with 2 losses in the L3W have seen their division lead dissolve. CHI is painfully weak vs the run giving up 197 ypg (5.9) the L5W due to injuries which allows their foes to set the tempo. A less than 100% Peterson had 146 yds (4.6) vs an equally bad GB unit which

helped Ponder stay out of trouble (103.9 QBR) in LW's tie. It's unknown if Cutler (ankle) has any chance here but if not McCown gets the #30 pass def giving up a 14-1 ratio due to some really poor play at safety. MIN has covered 3 of 4 vs the #32 #29 and #21 def's and now host the #26 here. The dog is 5-1-1 ATS in Bears games right now and while Ponder isn't the answer his continuity in the system and playing at home has the call for the home team by a FG in a higher scoring game.

SAN FRANCISCO by 7 over St Louis - STL is 5-2 ATS in the series and in are in a good spot with a bye two weeks ago followed by a home game vs tired Bears team. SF is off two tough losses to CAR/NO followed by a long flight vs WAS on MNF and Div fav's of 7 or more are 5-13-2 ATS off MNF. Kaepernick has regressed (180 ypg 56% 11-7 TY vs 240 ypg 62% 14-5 LY starts inc playoffs) partially due to defenses catching up to him and partially due to the lack of explosiveness at WR. As a result SF has the #29 offense TY vs #11 LY. STL defense is peaking allowing 85 ypg (3.8) rush the L4W along with a 5-7 pass ratio and they showed LY that they aren't intimidated by the 49ers physical style. With a ground game avg 190 ypg (5.6) the L4W, Clemens just has to avoid turning the ball over (4-0 ratio L3W) and the OL has been very respectable in pass pro with 26 sacks so far (11th). We'll call for STL keep it close as SF has SEA on deck and simply winning will be good for them while STL would like nothing more than to prove they belong.

New England by 10 over HOUSTON - Inc playoffs, HOU is just 4-12 SU/3-12-1 ATS since getting throttled by NE 42-14 on MNF. HOU's QB issues are well known but a deeper look at the defense shows their real problems. Over that span HOU is allowing 118 ypg (4.2) on the ground (would be 21st TY), a stunning 26-5 ratio, -15 TO's adding up to 25.7 ppg allowed. NE is off B2B primetime games and while those results aren't known the Panther game was the 1st time TY that Brady had Vereen, Amendola and Gronkowski at his disposal. NE could be off B2B losses here and the last time they did that they throttled BUF 52-28 as a 4 pt AF LY. Brady has struggled on the road with just a 76.3 QBR vs 88.0 LY. Still, you have Belichick vs a Texans offense with no confidence, Brady with an offense getting better with more snaps and they have something to play for here.

SAN DIEGO by 4 over Cincinnati - The Bengals spent their bye watching both PIT and BAL win and keep within range of the AFC North. Dalton has moved his team away from home avg 427 ypg in their 4 non-div road games but they are 2-2 SU as losses to CHI and MIA were in part fault of a 2-5 ratio. CIN looks to have the edge coming off their bye week but they are 4-8 ATS doing so and are 0-3 ATS as an AF TY vs CLE. BUF and MIA showing that they tend to play down to lesser foes. The Bengals also could be in look ahead mode as they host IND next followed by PIT. They do have the edge with the #9 and #6 units (-2 TO's) vs SD's #7 and #28 units (-4 TO's). Rivers shredded a solid KC defense for 392 yds (69%) with 3 tds LW and despite the 3 non-covering losses prior he had SD in position to win each of them late in the game and the ground game is rolling strong with 130 ypg (4.4) the L3W. We'll call for the home team to make this a tougher than expected meeting for the Bengals.

NY Giants at Washington (Night) - Skins are playing their 3rd prime time event and second straight with the SF results unknown. Prior to that game WAS won and covered their previous two at home and all 4 here have been decided by 6 points or less. The Giants 4 game win streak came to a tough end LW after rallying tie late. This is NY's first road game in 5 weeks and while they are 1-4 SU (2-3 ATS) they are only getting outgained by 18 ypg. Can the Skins cover a 6th straight in this series or will the Giants move to 12-5 ATS as a division AD?

New Orleans at Seattle (Monday) - First meeting since the 2010 Wild Card when the 7-9 Seahawks were +10 and pulled off the upset at home. The Saints D let them down that game as Brees threw for 404 (65%) with a 2-0 ratio. Both teams now face off with extra rest as the Seahawks are off a bye and the Saints off a Thursday Night win. The NFC #1 seed may very well be on the line and while the 12th man is a massive edge for the home team and Seattle has won 13 straight here (10-3 ATS) the Saints have gone 17-2 SU and 14-4-1 ATS with Payton.
