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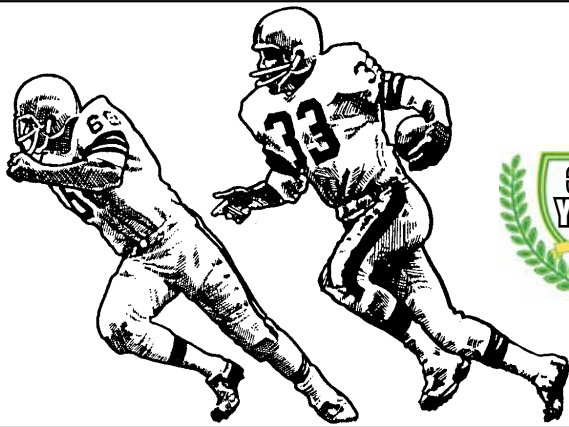

## KEY SELECTIONS

**4★ Nebraska over MINNESOTA** - The Gophers started the season 4-0 building some excitement but the reality is the 2 FBS home wins came versus UNLV and San Jose and they were still outgained by 80 ypg. After getting overmatched by Iowa and Mich, Minny, off a bye LW, did get a win over NWB but they benefitted from +3 TO's and the fact that NW was playing w/o QB Colter and RB Mark. That DD outright upset win gave us some added value here. Nebraska now takes the field for only their 3rd gm in 5 wks and prior to their bye they traveled to another offensively challenged program in Purdue holding them to 11 FD's, 1.3 ypc and 1 td on a 55-yd pass with :50 left (161 yds allowed F/59:10). We should see the return of Martinez at QB (missed L/3) and he along with a D that has totaled 16 sacks the L/4 gms will give the expected "Sea of Red" a homefield feel winning and covering a 3rd straight in this series despite laying DD's in each.

**FORECAST: Nebraska by 21 over MINNESOTA**

**3★ SMU over Temple** - While these 2 haven't met since 1946 it's worth noting that their all-time series record is 0-0-2. SMU is 7-6 SU on HC here at Gerald J Ford Stadium but they won the L/2 by a comb 89-37. After a 3-15-1 ATS run as a HF SMU went 3-0 ATS in that role LY (0-1 TY but that was vs FCS). Both tms come in off wins as SMU upset Memphis 34-29 (+3). The gm was very misleading as the Ponies led 34-3 before Mem got 2 FR td's and then drove 80/9pl getting a td pass on the final play of the gm. SMU's offense is s't'g to get in gear as in the L/2 gms they have avg'd 178 ypg more than what their opp was all'g. LW Temple won its 1st gm of the Rhule era as they beat Army 33-14 (E). While they did benefit from 4 Army TO's and were OT'd 22-17, the Owls did lead the game 33-10 in the 2H before Army scored a couple of td's. SMU has a bye on deck while Temple is playing for 5th str week and the last trip to Texas for the Owls was '89 (Hou). Temple just faced the option LW and now shifts gears to the run and shoot and making a long trip. Ponies pick up an easy win.

**3★ Houston (+) over RUTGERS** - First mtg. Flood is 2-0 ATS off a bye and only has Temple and another bye on deck. UH is off physical gm vs BYU and has a tough stretch ahead (USF, at UCF, at L'Ville). RU comes in off a much needed bye but they will still not have the services of RB James here (should be back next wk). They are also very young and thin in the secondary as they lost str Toler to inj and the other s't'g CB Thomas left the program. They rank just #75 in our pass eff D as they are all'g 307 ypg (62%) w/a 15-4 ratio. That's not good news going up against a high-powered UH attack incl QB O'Korn who is avg 249 ypg (61%) w/a 14-4 ratio TY. While they dropped their 1st gm of the ssn SU, our beloved Cougs continue to cash weekly **3★** Key Selections on these pages as they nearly pulled the outright upset over BYU (47-46, +10). The home-town Cougs led 40-34 in the 4Q but couldn't hang on. While RU does have the situational edge here a favorable matchup for UH is an aggressive D that had 8 sks LW against a RU OL that all'd 8 sks in their L/outing vs L'Ville. There is no way we are going against the only tm in the country that remains unbeaten at 6-0 ATS.

## OTHER SELECTIONS

**2★ Texas over TCU** - TCU is 2-20 SU and 7-14-1 ATS vs Texas and the L/time they won 2 str was in 1958 and '59. Texas had always played A&M on Thanksgiving wknd but LY TCU filled that slot. UT (-7) but was int'd at the 2 and 6 yd lines, missed a 25 yd FG and TCU after a fmb'l drove 16 yds for a td to lead 14-3. Texas was SOD at the 47 with 1:10 left on their last drive. UT is 32-8-1 SU and 25-13-2 ATS (1 NL) after a bye and is also 13-1 SU and 11-3 ATS after the Red River Rivalry (did lose ATS L'V). After a disastrous 1-2 start, the Horns have righted the ship and are atop the B12 at 3-0. In their L/gm, their RB's ran downhill and ran over OU as they had a 255-130 rush yd edge in their 36-20 win (+12). New DC Robinson has made a big diff at UT as after generating 2 sks in the 1st 3 gms, they have 13 in the L/3. TCU was actually 0-4 SU/ATS in B12 HG's LY and was not impressive in their one HG TY only beating KU 27-17 (-24). We have not been impressed w/them in any of their gms TY incl LW's 24-10 loss (+7) to OSU. We love the fact that the Horns are confident, rested off a bye, playing w/vengeance and are getting pts here. Also expect to see plenty of burnt orange in the stands. Hook 'em Horns!

**FORECAST: Texas by 6 over TCU**

**2★ OHIO ST over Penn St** - The home team was 8-1 SU and 9-0 ATS from 1998-'06 but has gone just 1-5 SU/ATS since. Ohio St is 8-3 SU/7-4 ATS vs Penn St. LY OSU (E) trailed 7-0 and the gm was tied 7-7 at HT. An early 2H at a 17 yd IR td sparked OSU to score 21 of the next 24 pts to lead 28-10 into the 4Q. OSU is a super 45-21-1 ATS (68%) in all B10 gms! LW though was one of their rare non-covers as they beat Iowa 34-24 (-17) to win their 19th str gm. After watching Iowa's offense control the opening half, the Bucks outgained them 306-153 in the 2H. They also piled up a 23:05-6:55 TOP edge in the 2nd stanza. While the Bucks D is atrocious vs the pass, they are only all'g 92 rush ypg (3.0) in the run heavy B10. The Nittany Lions, off a bye, had one of their more exciting wins in sch'l history in their L/outing beating Mich 43-40 (+2) in 4OT's but now they go from a home "white-out" atmosphere to playing at night in the Shoe. Penn St is 1-9 SU/ATS the last 7 years vs Top 10 ranked tms. Bucks need many blowout wins to try to impress the voters and they get one here.

## OTHER GAMES

**Thursday, October 24th • Kentucky at MISS ST** - The SU winner has covered 11 in a row in this series with 4 outright upsets the L8Y. UK had been 5-2 SU/ATS from '02-'08 but MSU has now covered 4 in a row. LY MSU (-9) was our almost 5★ and they had 25-13 FD and 427-228 yd edges. They had a 172-4 yd edge and led 14-0 right out of the box. At the end of the game, MSU had a 1st and gl at the 2 and was taking a knee. MSU comes in off a bye (3rd str yr this is the case prior to UK) but UK is also off a bye as well with only FCS Alabama St on deck.

**Marshall at MIDDLE TENNESSEE** - MU is 2-0 ('92 and '94 IAA Playoff gms) but this is the 1st meeting as FBS opp's. Both tms have poor technical records here as MU is 3-6 ATS off a bye while Middle is also coming in off a bye (4-0 ATS but were 0-6 ATS prior). MT is 1-6 ATS as a HD the L/4 yrs but Marshall is just 1-10-2 ATS as an AF. MU is +152 ypg while MT is -113 ypg on the yr but MT has played the tougher sked (#52-109).

**Friday, October 25th • Boise ST at BYU** - BS has won all 3 meetings ('03, '04, '12) in this series SU but BYU has covered the L/2. The visitor is actually 3-0 ATS. LY's gm was a def struggle with Boise (-6) having a slim 261-200 yd edge. BS missed a 43 yd FG in the 1H with a 170-52 yd edge and then had no confidence in their K after that. While BS was SOD twice, their only td came on a 36 yd IR td. BYU went 95/11pl for a td with 3:37 left but went for 2 and failed. It was the first time Boise had failed to score a td at home since becoming an FBS member. After both tms started the ssn off slow, they have rebounded and come in on nice winning streaks. Which tm takes another step?

**Georgia Tech by 4 over VIRGINIA** - The home team has absolutely dominated this series going 16-2 SU/15-3 ATS with the HT being a dog 8 times and having 6 outright upsets. Two years ago, UVA had a bye the week before GT and at home, upset the 6-0 Yellow Jackets 24-21 (+7) delivering another outright upset for the PPH Big Dog POW (4 outright upsets LW! Get your Big Dog Plays this week for just \$9 on your VIP Card). LY GT was playing with legit revenge and their DC was Al Groh who was the ex-HC of UVA. GT had a 594-294 yd edge and won easily 56-20 (-10) at home. GT is playing a 7th str wk and 3rd AG in 4 wks while UVA is in the midst of 3 gm home stand. LW we loved GT's situation as they were in need of a win getting the Cuse on B2B road while also having never prepped for the option. GT easily cashed a **3★** Key Selection on these pages as well as our **4★** Top Weekly LPS in a 56-0 (-7) rout w/26-10 FD and 482-208 yd edges. The 56 pt MOV was their largest ever in an ACC gm. While GT comes in riding high, UVA has now lost 4 str gms and LW inexplicably blew a 22-0 lead all'g Duke 35

unanswered pts in a loss. UVA HC London should be feeling some heat as the Cavs came in one of the more exp'd tms in the ACC and it doesn't get easier w/Clem, Miami and VT still on the sked. The series says take the home team and LW's 56-0 score inflated the line.

**UCF by 31 over Connecticut** - First meeting. Both tms have byes on deck. The Knights come in 5-1 SU/ATS after arguably their biggest win in sch'l hist 38-35 (+14) over #8 L'Ville giving us a Fri Night marquee outright upset winner. It was only their 2nd win ever over a ranked opp in 27 att as down 28-7 they scored 3 td's in a span of 7:22 to tie. Then down 35-31, they went 75/1 pl getting a td w/23 left. They now control their own destiny in the AAC and have their sights set on a 1st ever BCS trip but need to avoid the letdown here. Despite the fact Conn interim HC Weist had cch'd at Cincy the prev 3Y, his knowledge of the Bearcats personnel didn't help much as the Huskies dropped to 0-6 SU/1-5 ATS after a 41-16 loss (+14). Frosh QB Boyle who Weist named the str'r after taking over is only comp 45% of his passes w/a 0-3 ratio. While you would normally think letdown here, keep in mind, UCF does have a bye, will be in front of an excited home crowd and UC has lost their 2 AG's TY by an avg of 41-14.

**Ball St by 13 over AKRON** - Last met in 2010 (BSU 37-30, -13) and the last trip to Akron was '08 (BSU 41-24, -7). Ball St is on B2B road (17-4-1 ATS) and have a bye on deck (5-0 ATS) while Akron is playing for the 9th straight week. Coming into the year, Ball St had not been a DD road favorite s/'08, they have handled it well now going 2-0 SU/ATS after LW's 38-17 win (-20) over WM. The Cards are now 7-1 SU on the yr and have passed for 300+ yds in every outing as Wenning is avg 328 ypg (61%) w/an 18-5 ratio. The streaks are finally over for Akron! LW's 24-17 win (-7) over MU broke: their 30-gm road losing streak; their 19-gm MAC losing streak; and 3 str ssn's of only winning 1 gm a yr. The 7 pt margin was also misleading as they missed on some scoring opportunities in the 1H and then led 24-7 in the 4Q before MU scored 2 long td's in the final 5:00. While they are only 2-6 on the yr, we have been impressed w/the Zips in 5 of their L/6 gms despite playing a rather tough sked for a MAC tm. BSt handles the DD road fav role well again.

**OHIO by 31 over Miami, Oh** - OU had won 6 in a row SU in this series by 14 ppg (5-1 ATS) but MU was a 7 pt HD LY and pulled the outright upset beating #23 Ohio. OU had just played 3 of the worst teams in the NCAA and been outgained in all 3. At the end of the game, OU could have kicked a FG to go to OT but tried to run one more play and it proved costly as QB Telleton was tk'd and MU got the upset as another Big Dog POW outright upset winner. This is OU's only HG in a 4 wk stretch and LW they played an emotional EM tm who was playing just 24 hrs after a teammate had been found dead. After jumping out to a 21-7 lead, OU saw EM tie it at 21 in the 3Q before the Bobcats closed the game on a 35-7 run. They did only have 24-22 FD and 547-477 yd edges as they benefitted from 3 EM TO's. MU, could make the case for the worst tm in the country TY as after losing to lowly UMass 2 wks ago, LW they saw Akron break their 30-gm road losing streak against them in a 24-17 loss (+7). The gm was also misleading as MU scored 2 long td's in the L/5:00. The MU offense is avg 199 ypg less than what their opp's are all'g and the D is all'g 105 ypg more than what their opp's are avg. Both of those marks are worst in the country. Look for the Bobcats to be able to name the score here as they get revenge from last year.

**Buffalo by 9 over KENT ST** - The visitor has now won 4 in a row SU and is 6-2 SU (7-1 ATS) in this series. LY was a Wed nighter and UB had planned to showcase star RB Oliver but he suffered a leg injury at the end of the 1H DNR. QB Zordich for UB had a horrendous game hitting a 46 yd Hail Mary pass at the end of the half but the rest of the game was 3-21-46. Trailing by 6, he was int'd at the 2 in the 3Q and then tossed another int with 3:47 left set up KSt for a 15 yd td drive with :43 left and a 23-7 final. Beat-up Kent St is playing a 9th str wk and LW were playing w/o QB Reardon (CS) and RB Durham (CS) in a 38-21 loss (+7) to USA. The final was misleading as they got a td pass w/06 left. QB Fisher was 14-26-181-2-0 in his 1st start but benefitted from having all-everything Archer who had 2 70+ yd td's. We thought very highly of the Bulls coming into the ssn and they haven't let us down as they come in winners of 5 str incl the L/4 by an avg of 37-7. LW they beat UMass 32-3 (-19) in the rain as they continue to dominate the LOS. Oliver ran for 216 yds while breaking the sch'l career rec for rush yds and the UB rush D is all'g just 74 (2.2) their L/4 gms. Look for them to again control the LOS here as Kent St is all'g 228 rush ypg (5.6) as they become bowl elig for the 1st time s/'08.

**W Michigan by 3 over UMASS** - Under former coach Cubit WM usually pounded weaker foes and did just that to UMass LY in their first ever meeting. They led 28-0 before an int set up a UM 34 yd drive for a td w/04 left to pull them within 28-7 at half. Trailing 52-7, after a 29 yd PR, UM drove 27 yds for a td with 1:41 left in the gm in a 52-14 walloping (-16' at home). WM is playing a 9th str week but finally has a bye on deck. HC PJ Fleck's 1st yr so far has been one to forget as the Broncos are winless at 0-8 getting outscored by 25 ppg and outgained by 131 ypg. UM hasn't fared much better as after notching their 1st win of the ssn, they ran into a hot UB tm LW and lost 32-3 (+19'). They are getting outscored 29-8 on the yr while getting outgained by 165 ypg. HC Molnar was the QB cch at W Mich in '03-'04 and this is a big gm here to show his program is making strides by getting their 2nd MAC win. Year 2 of one HC's tenure against Year 1 of another and it shows in what has become the MAC's weekly edition of Resistible Force vs Movable Object.

**NORTH CAROLINA by 5 over Boston College** - The Tar Heels have 3 str wins/covers vs the Eagles. BC is 0-3 at Chapel Hill and the LTH ('08) we used NC as a 2★ on these pages and they won 45-24 (+2). BC comes in off a bye while UNC has a couple extra days rest off a Thurs Night HG vs Miami but do have archival NC State on deck (4-4 ATS). We have been impressed w/the Eagles under 1st-yr HC Addazio as he has established a toughness and grit we haven't seen here in the past few yrs and they have covered 3 str gms incl vs the top 2 ACC tms in FSU and Clem. LW the Heels possibly blew their chance to save their ssn as they couldn't take adv of a UM tm playing w/o their top RB and WR for most of the gm and the fact that Hurricane QB Morris had a miserable 0-4 ratio. The 2 tms comb for 1,056 yds but only managed 50 pts as the Heels blew a 10-pt 4Q lead all'g a td w/16 left in the loss. While UNC is the better tm, tough to lay too many pts here with a tm that has lost 4 str gms.

**Clemson by 7 over MARYLAND** - MD was on a 6-3 SU, 8-2 ATS run up until '09 but CU has won the L/3 SU and ATS winning SU by 24, 11 and 35. LY CU was -31' and MD was w/o their top WR Diggs, top RB and leading tk'r and already down to 5th string QB who'd been playing at LB. CU finished with 27-10 FD and 436-180 yd edges and won 45-10. CU is off their most important gm of the ssn (HG vs FSU) while MD has a bye on deck. Both tms suffered devastating losses LW as the Tigers ACC/Nat'l Title hopes were destroyed by visiting FSU to the tune of 51-14 (+3) as the Tigers needed a 71/16pl td drive w/13 left (led by bkp QB Stoudt) just to get to 14. MD also got beat LW 34-10 (-4') at WF. Even more damaging was the loss of one of the top WR tandems in the country in Diggs/Long who are now both OFY after suffering leg injuries. HC Edsall can't catch a break on the inj front for the 2nd yr in a row. While the situation clearly favors MD here, you have to wonder what the frame of mind of both tms will be.

**VIRGINIA TECH by 18 over Duke** - VT is 9-0 SU winning by an avg of 24 ppg and has outgained Duke in all 9 by an avg of 216 ypg (Duke 3-2 ATS run). The home team has covered 4 in a row incl LY's improbable win. VT (-10) trailed 20-0 in the 1Q. Duke was up 20-10 when the key play of the game happened as a pass bound off a WR's hands, was int'd and VT got a 39 yd td pass on the next play to get within 20-17 and take momentum. VT scored on their opening three 3Q drives and after Duke was SOD with 9:32 left, VT got an 86 yd td run for the 41-20 win and cover. VT is 15-9-1 ATS after a bye and only has BC on deck. After the loss to Bama in the opener, VT has won 6 str and have certainly become a play-on tm as they have won 2 str LPS for us and their #3 D is all'g 180 ypg less than what their opp are avg (#2). Duke is on B2B road gms (amazingly 16-3-1 ATS!) w/bye on deck. LW the Blue Devils scored 35 unanswered pts overcoming a 22 pt 1H deficit to beat UVA and they are now in prime position for a 2nd str bowl gm. This ironically is also a 2nd str yr the Devils travel here w/5 wins on the ssn and it will be their 2nd str DD loss as we continue to ride the Hokie train!

**Pitt by 1 over NAVY** - Navy is just 1-6 ATS in HC Gms. The Midshipmen are 2-8-1 SU but 6-5 ATS s/'79 vs the Panthers. Navy has been a HD just once in the L3Y (0-1 ATS being shutout). The L/gm was in '09, Navy lost 27-14 (+7). The Midshipmen never led and trailed 24-7 into the 4Q only gaining 218 yds (129 rush, 2.8). Pitt will see the option offense for 2 str wks (here and GT next wk) and they already faced option NM earlier TY. LW they had pass-happy ODU and won 35-24 (-17). After falling behind 10-0 in the 1Q, they trailed 28 unanswered pts to take control but were outFD'd 25-18. The Mids come in off B2B losses as both tms have played Duke TY (Navy lost 35-7 while Pitt won 58-55). LW Navy piled up a 35-21 FD edge but a key 68-yd FR td for Toledo and a missed xp in 2OT proved to be the difference in their 45-44 loss (+9). While Navy has their backs against the wall, Pitt has one of the best DT's in the country in Donald (leads nation in sks and tfl per gm) and this one goes down to the wire.





# UNDERDOG PLAY OF THE WEEK

Over 32 years this play has been a reader favorite hitting 213-158. The last 14 years the Underdog Play of the Week has recorded numerous **OUT-RIGHT UPSET WINNERS (50!)** to the incredible record **INCLUDING 4 TY** including 3 straight outright winners!!!!!! Here is TW's Underdog Play:

## FAU (+25) over Auburn

FAU covered here in '11 only losing 30-14 (+31). In that gm, the Tigers got outFD'd 20-16 and led just 10-6 at HT but got an IR td and a 51 yd td pass to open the gap. FAU is 1-5 ATS after a bye, however they are 6-1 ATS TY and if not for a couple of bone-headed decisions by HC Pelini, could be 5-2 SU (lost 3 gms by a total of 12 pts). They are also on one of the more impressive ATS streaks in the country as they are 11-0 ATS as an AD covering by an avg of 11 ppq. QB Johnson in his L/3 starts is avg 269 ypg (61%) w/a 6-3 ratio and has also added 217 rush (4.3) and 4 td's while leading a offense that has avg'd 492 ypg in those 3 gms. They now have a great situational edge here as the Tigers have already clinched bowl elig (just 3-9 LY) and are off arguably their biggest win s/the Nat'l Champ gm at the end of the 2010 ssn! The 45-41 win (+13) over #7 A&M had Aub players/cch's celebrating like they had just won the SB and some even teared up on the sidelines afterwards. Now they deal with a tm that knows how to cover as an AD, has an offense that can generate yds/pts and also covered twice in SEC country LY.

**FORECAST: AUBURN by 14 over Florida Atlantic**

**Stanford by 1 over OREGON ST** - The home team is 5-1 SU/4-2 ATS with a pair of outright upsets. OSU was 8-3 SU/ATS from '98-'09 but SU has won the last 3 SU (2-0-1 ATS). LY SU jumped out to a 14-0 lead with Hogan getting his first start at QB and at the half had a 285-160 yd edge. OSU battled back and led 23-14 when SU got a 24 yd td on the last play of the 3Q. OSU QB Vaz had the ball fall out of his hand while he was at a pass and SU rec'd at the 29 and would get a td w/5:30 left for the 27-23 lead and OSU was SOD at their own 31 with 1:54 left. SU is 13-4 ATS as an AF but OSU is 23-8 SU in Pac-12 HG's and are 13-7 ATS in the series. After a shocking opening-season loss to FCS E Wash, the Beavers continue to impress and have won 6 str gms thanks to the nation's leading passer Mannion who is avg 427 ypg (69%) w/an amazing 29-3 ratio. We liked Stanford off an upset loss LW and they easily won as our NC Sportsline Comp College (the play that just missed out being star-rated LPS selection. Get it for FREE every Sat by calling 347-677-1700). After a lackluster 1H the Cardinal took control and won 24-10 (-4) as they dominated the LOS (192-74 rush edge) over the Bruins. While we normally like big, physical tms vs pass-happy tms, we fade the Cardinal here as they are only +44 ypg TY while Oreg St is +119.

**WKU by 6 over Troy** - WKU is now 5-1 ATS in this series. Troy had won 4 in a row SU but WKU has been favored and won the last 2. The fav is 6-0 SU. LY Troy was +2 at home and the key story was that starting QB Robinson was lost on the final play of the 1H and Troy led 17-7 at the time. Troy's bkp QB Anthony had been used mostly in the Wildcat role and was 9-16 for 147. WKU is off huge HG vs Louisiana (extra prep Tue gm) while Troy is off a bye (7-15-1 ATS). After 3 str wins/covers, WKU was beating UL 10-0 at the end of the 1Q but then it all came crashing down in a 37-20 loss (-4) as we got a Tue Night outright upset winner. UL pounded the WKU DL to the tune of 254 rush yds but overall the WKU D is all g a respectable 350 ypg. They will be tested vs a Troy off avg 487 ypg. In their L/gm they were -16 but had to hang on for a 35-28 win over FBS bottom feeder GSt. Their D is all g 464 ypg as they are giving up 113 ypg more than what their opp are avg. Winner here does make a big step towards a possible bowl while remaining in the SB champ race.

**Notre Dame by 21 over AIR FORCE** - Irish are 23-6 SU overall and 9-5 ATS since 1986 vs the Falcons. LTH was '06 and the Falcons have dropped 6 straight at home (1-5 ATS) vs the Irish. In the L/3 mtg's ('11, '07 and '06) AF has outgained and outFD'd the Irish by 43 ypg and 4 FD's/gm but went just 1-2 SU/ATS. Irish are off archival USC (4-6 ATS) while AF is off a bye w/Army on deck (6-0 ATS). The Falcons have lost 6 str gms but have led at HT in each of their L/3 gms before wearing down. They could be st'g their 4 diff QB here due to inj. Since Kelly and staff were embarrassed by Navy in '10 (35-17 loss 1st time seeing option), the Irish are a perfect 4-0 SU/ATS vs Service Academies w/an avg score of 48-15 and avg cover by 18 ppg! ND did have a bye 2 wks ago and have Navy on deck and should be spending time on option. LW they jumped out to a 14-10 1H lead over USC and then won a battle of attrition as the Trojans played w/o RB Madden for the gm and also WR Lee DNP the 2H while ND lost QB Rees early in the 3Q and managed only 1 FD after w/Hendrix under C. They were fortunate as USC did miss 2 FG's. As of press-time both tms are dealing w/QB injuries so we'll call for the Irish by 3 td's and see where Vegas tells us to lean.

**ULM by 17 over Georgia St** - First meeting. ULM comes in off a bye (3-6 ATS reg ssn) while GSt is on B2B road. While the Panthers have won only 1 gm in the L/2 yrs, they have now covered 5 str gms and each of their L/3 by DD's. LW they were a 16 pt AD but only lost by 7 at TXSt as they had a 20-15 FD edge (did score a td w/0:01 left but TXSt scored w/1:43 left). ULM beat that same TXSt tm in their L/outing 21-14 (+6) but benefitted from two 70+ yd IR td's by Newsome (basically two 14-pt swings). The bye week all'd them to work on getting QB Brown some more reps as he has just a 1-6 ratio TY filling in for the inj'd Browning. At 3-4, they still have bowl hopes but can't afford to overlook any opp.

**TEXAS ST by 3 over South Alabama** - First meeting. LY both were in their first season as FBS members. Texas St is playing a 3rd str HG off a nice confidence boosting win over GSt (24-17, -16). On the other side, USA continues to impress us TY as they took adv of a Kent St tm playing w/o their st'g QB and RB Durham and won 38-21 (-7). It was their 5th straight cover and in the Jags' 3 losses TY, they have lost them by a comb 9 pts. However, their cover streak has finally caught the attention of Vegas and they have been listed as an early AF for the 1st time in schl history. While we normally don't like going against streaks, TXSt is a solid 10-6 SU at home under Franchione. They are 3-1 ATS mark as a HD incl an impressive 42-21 win (+12) over WY earlier TY and are outgaining their foes at home TY by 105 ypg.

**MISSISSIPPI by 35 over Idaho** - First meeting. In Freeze's first ssn they went 4-0 SU/3-1 ATS vs non-AQ teams winning by an avg of 37-12. The Vandals have dropped 13 str road gms by 38 ppg (3-10 ATS) and are just 12-72 (14%) the L13Y. Idaho is just 2-6 ATS (reg ssn only) after a bye week while Miss is off 4 tough SEC gms but eases into the light portion of their sked and has a bye on deck. A wk after blowing a late lead over Top 10 A&M, the Rebs finally got their signature win as they upset #6 LSU LW 27-24 (+10) getting a 41-yd FG on the final play. They did lead the gm 17-0 in the 3Q but a D playing w/o 5 str's incl their leading tk'r started to wear down. They did have a 525-388 yd edge in the gm. ID could be playing this gm w/o each of their Top 2 QB's in Chalach and McCain while their D is all g a whopping 541 ypg. Even though the Rebs will probably be in letdown mode, Freeze is 9-3 ATS as a HF and the Rebs came name the score here.

**North Texas by 7 over SOUTHERN MISS** - HC and only HG in a 4 wk stretch. NT is on B2B road gms (5-11 ATS). Only recent meeting was the '04 New Orleans Bowl, which SM won 31-10 (-6). S Miss HC Todd Monken coached under Dan McCarney at Iowa St. He was the WR cch and pass gm coord ('02-'04). Stark contrast in the confidence level of these two tms as NT comes in off B2B DD CUSA wins while SM's utility streak has now reached 18 consec losses after getting crushed 55-14 (+23) at EC LW. QB Bridgford was finally yanked for Mullens LW and he did provide a spark going 9-17-97-2-1 but it should be noted that all came in the 4Q when the Eagles were already down 55-0. NT's 28-13 win (-3) LW snapped their own futility record as they had 26 consec losses foll'g a SU win dating back to 2004! While NT is clearly the better tm (incl a #88-120 off edge), we fade them here as they are in a DD away favorite role for the 1st time since 2003.

**Louisiana Tech by 3 over FIU** - First meeting. FIU comes in off a bye but prior to LY's win over archival FAU, they were 0-16 SU and 1-12 ATS all-time after a bye! After being arguably the worst tm in CFB for the 1st month of the ssn, the Panthers have started to show some life in their L/2 gms as they upset SM 24-23 (+17) and then almost pulled another in a 27-24 loss to UAB (+6). The key is them getting back QB Medlock who threw for 302 yds in the L/gm. After coming into the ssn as one of the more inexp'd tms in the country, it comes to us as no surprise that LT is 2-5 SU/ATS after their 28-13 loss to NT (+3) giving us a LPS Totals Play winner on the UNDER. After having one of the best offenses in the country LY (also one of the worst D's), Bulldog gms are now 1-6 to the UNDER TY. Tough to lay too many pts here on the road and we can't believe we are typing this after their horrendous start, but we are backing the home team Panthers here.

**MISSOURI by 4 over South Carolina** - LY SC's QB Shaw missed his 1st pass but hit his final 20 passes. MU came in with a banged up OL and struggled vs SC's excellent def front and had a season low 254 yds.

## TECHNICAL PLAY OF THE WEEK..... WASHINGTON REVENGE PLAY OF THE WEEK..... OHIO SITUATIONAL PLAY OF THE WEEK..... HAWAII

MU (+10) did not score until bkp QB Berkstresser led them 75/11 pl for a td with :17 left. 3rd str AG for SC in SEC play and only 3rd time that has happened in L/22 yrs (0-2 ATS prior 2 in 3rd str AG). MU is in midst of 3 str HG's. Who would have thought in the preseason that the Tigers would be alone atop the SEC East standings. Shockingly, a win here almost assures them of a spot in the SEC champ gm (barring a total collapse) as they would hold at least 2-gm leads over the rest of the division and also have tie-breaker edges over UGA, UF and SC. LW even w/o QB Franklin, the Tigers crushed UF 36-17 (+3) as their off put up 500 yds on what many considered the best D in the country. Bkp QB Mauk was 18-36-295-1-1 and it is the aggressive MU D that continues to impress as they have 20 sks in the L/4 gms. SC is off a tough 23-21 loss (-7) to UT as the Vols kicked a FG on the final play. QB Shaw hurt his knee and is ? here. Considering their situational edge and Shaw hurt, it's tough to go against the Tigers here.

**Oklahoma St by 17 over IOWA ST** - Surprisingly OSU is just 4-4 SU and 4-4 ATS in this series with the home team 6-1 SU/ATS. OSU is 1-3 SU/ATS their L/4 trips here and last time were #2 AP when they were upset by Iowa St as a 27.5 pt fav, which cost them a shot at playing in the National Title game. LY OSU was at home playing with revenge and we used a 4★ Top Weekly LPS on OSU. They had a commanding 625-341 yd edge. OSU got a td with 10:09 left to lead 31-10 and finished the game at the ISU27 taking a knee. The SU winner is a perfect 11-0 ATS. LW OSU made a QB change to Chelfer after Walsh threw his 2nd int. While his stats weren't impressive (10-25-178-0-1), the off did finally move the ball better in a 24-10 win (-7) over TCU. Iowa St, meanwhile, ran into the buzzsaw known as BU and lost 71-7 (+33) giving us a LPS Totals Winner on the OVER. They also replaced their QB Richardson w/Fr/Fr rookie Rohach but Richardson came back in the 2H and it really didn't matter as they were out-gained 714-174! Look for HC Gundy to remind his players of what happened the L/time here and OSU is +85 ypg TY while Ist is -140.

**Baylor by 35 over KANSAS** - At 6-0 and off a 71-7 win (-33) over Iowa St, Baylor has their sights set for their upcoming Thursday home game vs Oklahoma on Nov 7. No matter how many times the coaching staff reminds the players that they have this trip to Lawrence first, will they be focused? We're not comparing Kansas to their in-state school rivals which covered vs Baylor in their other road game TY but the Bears have yet to prove they can handle the AF's role going 0-4 ATS the L3Y. In fact, the largest spread in that period was the last time here when they were -20' with a home game vs #5 Oklahoma on deck and needed OT to win 31-30. Baylor gets another easy win but do they get another cover as an inflated line?

**Louisville by 24 over USF** - The home team in 8-2 SU in this series and was 7-0 ATS but has dropped the L/3 ATS. There have been 3 outright upsets the L3Y. USF won 34-22 in '09 and on the road 24-21 in '10 but UL won at USF 34-24 in '11. LY it was a tough loss for USF. USF took the lead 25-21 with 3:09 left but UL would go 75/8pl for an 11 yd td pass w/1:35 left. USF got to midfield but was int'd at the 11. USF comes in off a bye (1-6 ATS) after B2B AAC wins giving 1st-yr HC Taggart a much-needed boost. However, those wins came w/o the offense scoring a single td as the Bulls became the 1st tm s/02 to win B2B gms w/o one. On the other side, the Nat'l Title dream (and BCS bowl for that matter) is over for the Cards as they blew a 3 td 3Q lead and lost to UCF 38-35 (-14) as we easily cashed a Fri Night Marquee on UCF. After the gm QB Bridgewater said, "We are the type of team that has mature guys, and I am pretty sure our guys are switching their focus to USF. One loss doesn't determine the whole season." Will UL suffer from bubble burst or will they follow their QB's post-gm comments?

**BOWLING GREEN by 4 over Toledo** - This used to be called the Peace Pipe Trophy but was renamed the Battle of 175. UT coach Campbell was a grad asst at BG and later an asst ch there. It's been a series of 3 game streaks. UT won 3 in a row SU and ATS from '04-'06. BG 3 in a row SU and ATS from '07-'09 and UT has now won 3 in a row SU (2-1 ATS) from '10-'12. The HT is 12-3 SU and 11-3 ATS with 5 outright upsets in the series s/'99. BG comes in off a bye (3-1 ATS) and sits at 3-0 in MAC play. Their most impressive performance on the ssn may have come in their L/gm as they nearly upset Miss St 21-20 (+11). QB Johnson has been a savior for a BG offense that had struggled for much of the L/couple of yrs as they are avg 467 ypg. The D is all g a surprising 5.0 ypc but most of that damage came against Indiana and Miss St. UT is off a thrilling 45-44 (-9) 2OT win over Navy but they did lose RB Fluellen, who was one of the FBS's leaders in rushing to what looked like a serious knee inj (CS). If he is out that will bring LO to lead the box vs QB Owens who only has a 5-6 ratio TY. Falcon Sr's get their 1st win over their rivals.

**RICE by 17 over Utep** - Rice was 6-1 SU with 4 outright upsets the L7Y and is 9-1 ATS in this series. Rice has won their L/3 at home vs UTEP by 8, 1 and 4 pts but were not favored in any. LY it was Mike Price's FHG. Trailing 26-21 UTEP settled for a 35 yd FG with 6:45 left then shockingly their KR D which was ranked #1 in the nation allowed a 96 yd KR td, Rice's first KR td s/'84 to make it a 9 pt gm and Rice had a 453-443 yd edge. Rice is playing for a 7th str week while UTEP comes in off a bye (3-0 ATS). This is their only HG in a 5 week stretch. The Owls are clearly the CUSA West favorites off 4 str wins and LW welcomed back RB Ross who ran for a career-high 167 yds as the Owls had 409 rush yds in their 45-19 win (-18) over NMST. That's not good news for a UTEP tm that is all g 247 rush ypg (6.1). Rice is on a 9-3 ATS mark as a HF and clinches bowl elig with a win here.

**Fresno St by 10 over SAN DIEGO ST** - Winner takes command of the West with the home team winning both previous games SU and SDDST covering both. Bulldogs offense is clicking behind Sr QB Carr topping 38+ in every game with a 70% comp rate but he has yet to be tested with only 2 road games at Hawaii with their #114 pass D and Idaho with their #122. He did shred the Aztecs at home LY as FSU totaled 655 yards (536 pass, 75%) but on the conf road he hit only 62% (280 ypg). Aztecs' HC Long is also his own DC and he remembers that defensive performance well while TY his newly tweaked 3-3-5 D confused NCAA-leader Mannion (427 ypg) holding him to a ssn low as well as the Oreg St team (516 ypg, 377 vs SDDST). Fresno does have the huge off edge (#15-100) and is the better team but they have been known to jump out to large leads TY and have given up a couple of backdoor covers. Will this be another one of those instances?

**Colorado St by 5 over HAWAII** - LY as new conf foes the Rams came away w/a 42-27 (-6) win. CSU trailed 14-7 but then scored 21 str. CSU led by 1 after a pair of UH FG's (26 and 43 yds) but they got two 4Q pick-6's to finish the scoring. One of the biggest situational edges of the week comes in this game as Hawaii is off a bye while CSU is on B2B road gms (2-11 ATS) making 1st trip here s/'96! They are also coming off their archival WY, in which they posted an impressive 52-22 win (+6) outgaining the Pokes at one pt 220-34. It's been a tough 0-6 start for UH but in the L/3 gms the offense has come alive thanks to a QB switch as they are avg 453 ypg after avg only 282 ypg the F/3. However, they have just come up short in each of those gms. CSt is just 1-12 ATS as an AF s/'03 but UH needs to step up and make some plays in crunch time before we call for them to pull the outright upset.

## KEY SELECTIONS

**4★ NEW ORLEANS by 20 over Buffalo** - Who loves bye weeks? The Saints do as they've won/covered 4 straight by a 42-25 avg score. Brees puts extra work in during the bye to make sure there is no fall off and has crushed avg 373 ypg (70%) w/a 16-3 ratio in his return. LY the Saints allowed 24 FD, 449 ypg and 26 ppg at home and after 3 games TY they're all g 18 FD, 315 ypg and 14 ppg. While BUF has cobbled a decent pass defense (#20 15-12 ratio) considering their injuries their #26 rush defense continues to be an issue allowing 140 ypg (4.1) minus the BAL game due to bad play calling on their part. BUF's #5 pass rush is a bit of a mirage as 6 sks came vs a bad CAR OL with Newton having a bad day and 5 were vs Weeden who has an MLB pitcher's pocket presence. The Bills win at MIA makes them 3-4 as well as 5-2 ATS but that will now work against them as teams take them more seriously. BUF also has to make its second long road trip with Lewis making his first ever start in a dome. Brees made a point to mention how the last second loss to NE left a bad taste in their mouth prior to the bye and they get back on track here.

**3★ NEW ENGLAND by 16 over Miami** - The shocker here is that the Patriots are 5-2 but if you watched every post game press conference this year you might have guessed 2-5? Well this time they are off a real loss and the hair Belichick is pulling out is because it was to Rex Ryan. The Patriots had been an automatic play off a SU loss but despite "only" going 5-4 ATS the L3Y they are now 24-9 ATS (73%). What makes this different is that since 2003 the Patriots are 51-12 SU vs the AFC East and they've won every game following a Div loss only failing to cover 2 which were both inflated DD spreads. The Dolphins 3-0 start has been followed by 3 straight losses with the offense avg just 13 FD/gm and an OL opening holes for only 3.9 ypc while allowing a now shaky Tannehill to be rocked for 4.3 sks/gm. NE's well documented defensive injuries were a major part of the Jets upset as they had 27 FD's and 177 yds rushing but MIA can't take advantage the same way. In the Dolphins last 2 road games they've allowed season highs to IND and Luck and NO and Brees so why not here as well?

## OTHER SELECTION

**2★ Pittsburgh by 13 over OAKLAND** - OAK pulled a 34-31 upset of PIT in OT early LY as a 3' pt HD despite PIT outgaining them 433-321 with Roethlisberger having a fine day (384, 73% 4 td's) vs a defense still in place. OAK has the situational edge being off a bye but the technicals work against them are they are 1-9 ATS in that role while also going 1-6-1 ATS as a non-div HD. PIT may have been the most enthusiastic 1-4 team ever as players talked about still being in it and still winning the AFC North. After their usual battle with BAL in which a team won by exactly 3 pts for the 9th time in 11 meetings they now look forward to grabbing a third straight win. Big Ben missed both Ravens games LY but the interesting note prior is that the Steelers have covered 5 straight the week following BAL as they are used to that smash mouth style. What OAK isn't accustomed to is having an offense as they've avg'd only 16 FD/gm the last 5 and that is with a rush attack gaining a respectable 130 ypg and 4.7 ypc. The Steelers rush D is rounding back into shape allowing BAL 82 (3.6) and the Jets 83 (4.2) the L2W and we'll always back a team that has both a better offense and better defense with an expectation to win.

## OTHER GAMES

**Carolina at Tampa Bay (Thursday)** - CAR is traveling on this short week playing their 3rd road game in 4 weeks but despite going 1-2 they've outFD'd all 3 of their foes on the road. The Bucs "perfect" season continues as they are now 0-6 SU and finally outgained their first foe LW. Will Newton and Co. get revenge for getting swept LY or will TB make a statement on Nat'l TV and cover another div HD role like they did vs the Saints earlier this season? **The VIP Marquee play is up on Thurs after noon et.**  
**San Francisco by 21 over Jacksonville († London)** - The fav has covered 4 of the last 5 in London with the loss being earlier TY with MIN (+3) upsetting PIT. LY NE was the first team to win in Wembley twice and after covering their first game by 13 pts they covered their return trip by 31. SF now also returns 3 years later after beating DEN as a 2' pt fav (24-16) in 2010. The overseas trip has been an equalizer as only 2 games have been decided by over 8 points but both times it was when NE was a sizable favorite against an 0-6 TB squad and vs a 3-4 STL team off a 2-14 season. Sound familiar? SF's non-div mastery under Harbaugh is now at 19-4-1 ATS and while JAX and their 0-7 SU & 1-6 ATS record would be a letdown spot the uniqueness will keep them interested. The Jaguars will be playing home games here the next 3 years as well but the UK would probably be happier watching Khan's other investment in Fulham FC.

**DETROIT by 7 over Dallas** - This is an excellent spot for the Lions here at home for the 2nd straight w/a bye on deck while the Cowboys are off their emotional shootout vs Denver, a SNF win vs WAS and a surprisingly defensive battle at PHI. That trio that the Cowboy's just faced were all ranked #27 or worse on defense and while DET ranks in the lower half they have just played 4 top 12 offenses in their last 5 games and held them to 21 ppg. On the flip side Stafford has faced MIN'S #32 D as well as WAS #24 and the team avg'd 455 ypg while throwing for 365 ypg and now he takes on DAL #28 and their 14-6 ratio (prior to getting 3 int's vs Barkley). The Lions despite LW's last sec loss (54 yd FG on final play after 28 yd punt) are starting to shed off the negativism from LY and prior to that they were 9-3 ATS at home vs non-div foes. DET is already 2-0 SU/ATS off a loss TY covering by 9 ppg and the Cowboys will bring the best out from the again rowdy Lions fans. This is only the second time in 8 years that Jerry's team has played B2B road games as a dog in both and visiting an unfriendly dome is a concern as DAL has dropped all 4 both SU/ATS since 2009.

**KANSAS CITY by 4 over Cleveland** - The Reid revival took far shorter than anyone could have imagined and the Arrowhead fans proved it with Guinness. The question is how good are they? They beat a winless Jaguars squad followed by 3 former NFC East teams that Reid knows as well as anyone that still only have a combined 7 wins. Next they played TEN with new QB Fitzpatrick making his first start, hosted 2nd year QB by default Pryor and then host an undrafted rookie QB. The Chiefs were able to rattle Keenum LW with 5 sacks and 5 qb. KC has allowed 5 of the 7 offenses they faced to top their season avg with only the Jaguars and Texans LW failing. They do have another favorable matchup here vs CLE with 2nd year QB Weeden but the Browns also bring the best scoring defense they've faced this year. In their top 4 scoring games KC is avg 28 ppg yet only gained 357 ypg and were +8 TO's vs scoring D's that avg'd #25. Now for the first time since 2008 a team that had 2 or fewer wins the previous season is favored by 8 pts or more the next. It's been a total of 11 teams that fit that criteria but MIA in '08 (1-15 in '07) was the only as a fav this large (-10) and the only beat the Raiders 17-15.

**NY Giants by 2 over PHILADELPHIA** - The dog improved to 5-1 ATS when the Eagles beat the Giants 36-21 in a game that wasn't as close as the final score. Philadelphia had a 18-8 FD and 303-184 yd edge at the half and Foles tallied 197 yds (64%) and 2 TD's after he replaced an ineffective Vick. Div AD's off a MNF game are 25-9-2 ATS and with a lost season the Giants can go all in here. However with MNF results unknown and as well as PHI's starting QB with Vick (hamstring) and Foles (concussion) being ?? it may be Matt Barkley's (129 yd 55%, 0-3 LW) first start. The Giants once proud D which is allowing 35 ppg has been in horrible situations as their 23 giveaways are 6 more than the #2. This and a weak pass rush due to a less than 100% JPP (1 sk in 6 gms) has exposed a bad back 7 (#24 pass def 14-4 ratio). PHI's defense is struggling due to its shift to a 3-4 and a rebuilt secondary (#31 pass def 14-8 ratio). With all the unknowns we'll call for the Giants as a dog and if they go to a favorite we'll let the line decide where we side.

**CINCINNATI by 8 over NY Jets** - Both teams are off come from behind upsets with the NY Jets earning a huge win versus the arch-rival Patriots. Geno Smith led 7 drives of 8+ plays but relied on the rush attack (177 yds). The Bengals cost us vs DET as they won on a last sec FG and they also knocked off NE just 3 weeks ago (341-248 edge) while pulling out an OT win at BUF sandwiched between. CIN has the most impressive home resume this season going 3-0 SU/ATS vs PIT, GB and NE and while they have a Thursday game on deck it is their only home showing in a 5 week span. You know NY's locker room celebration went into the evening but it could've very well be that Ryan gets his troops too emotional after an upset. Since 2010 they pulled a road upset or an upset at home after being more than a FG dog and they've gone 0-4 SU/ATS the game after failing to cover by over 2 TD's. The Jets have also rotated wins and losses this season and following their first 3 "W's" Smith has a 1-9 ratio the week after getting sacked 12 times!! The CIN DL had 16 sks the 4 gms prior to LW and while DET's OL in #4 in sacks allowed they'll have much more success against the Jets #28 OL in sacks. Added value with the Jets also being the only team with a winning record to be outscored on the season.

**DENVER by 13 over Washington** - From one high profile emotional game to another as Mike Shanahan faces his former team for the first time. DEN has a well earned bye on deck (7-4 ATS) and Manning gets another plum matchup vs the #21 pass defense that is allowing a 11-4 ratio with an 8.5 ypa so far. Griffin has a huge challenge ahead of him vs DEN's fully stocked and "lowly #30 Def" with Miller back LW. Yes, the Broncos give up yardage but it's by design. Their +0 TO's are avg due to the Jags game, they are 5th in def ypg (15.5) and are allowing just 70 ypg rush (3.2) as teams are one dimensional trying to play catchup w/ Manning. Griffin may be getting more comfortable but he's at a whole new level vs the Broncos here.

**ARIZONA by 1 over Atlanta** - When these 2 met in Atlanta LY the Falcons were -9' but only won 23-19 as Ryan had a game he won't forget finishing with an 0-5 ratio. The Cardinals have extra rest off a Thursday Night but they clearly need it having played SF and SEA in B2B weeks. In fact the Falcons played Sun vs TB they had a bye prior and are probably better rested and could finally get some players back. ARZ comes into this game at 3-4 knowing a win takes them into their bye at .500 but that added pressure explains why home teams are 10-25 ATS since 2009 prior to a bye when playing a similarly talented foe (line between +/- 3). This is a game in which you should throw out the records as the Falcons have the offensive edge (#9 vs #29) while the defenses are close (#19 vs #17). Atlanta's D may be in the bottom half, but by excluding games against a pair of HOF'ers in Brady and Brees the Falcons are allowing 333 ypg. Also never mind playing against interception prone Palmer who has tossed 2+ picks in his last 5 games (4-11 ratio) with an OL barely better than LY's.

**Green Bay at Minnesota (Sunday Night)** - B2B primetimers for the Vikings who may very well be 1-5 already using their third QB this season. The Packers however are 0-3 ATS on the road this year and lost here in LY's season finale making it 4 straight covers for the home team in this series. If MIN is off a loss expect this line to be over a TD and while GB is an elite team with 4 straight DD win seasons they are only 1-6 ATS as an AF of over 6 points and 0-3 ATS if the line is over 7. Can the Vikings make a stand in front of the National TV audience? **The Sunday night Marquee is available on Sunday afternoon after 12:00 noon ET. Call your Northcoast VIP Debit System for the winner!**

**Seattle at St Louis (Monday)** - The Seahawks came into this season 0-4 as an AF under Carroll while the Rams finished last season covering 6 straight as a dog. The opposite holds true this season as STL is 1-4 ATS as a dog while SEA is 3-1 ATS as an AF. As we often see when a team is becoming elite they pay the price of inflated lines and Seattle has won exactly ONE road game by over 6 points and that was last Thursday on another div road game were they were outFD'd. Can the Rams pull a second straight upset at home vs the Seahawks?
